THE DIVINE LITURGY OF ST. JOHN CHRYSOSTOM

The Priest begins Divine Liturgy with "Blessed is the Kingdom" and the choir responds "Amen." Bearing the Paschal Candle, the Priest then leads the singing of the Paschal Apolytikion and censes the west side of the Altar Table.

Priest: Blessed is the Kingdom of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit, now and ever and unto ages of age.

People: Amen.

THE GOSPEL READING John 20:19-31

On the evening of that day, the first day of the week, the doors being shut where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood among them and said to them, "Peace be with you." When He had said this, He showed them His hands and His side. Then the disciples were glad when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent Me, even so I send you." And when He had said this, He breathed on them, and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained."

Now Thomas, one of the Twelve, called the Twin, was not with them when Jesus came. So the other disciples told him, "We have seen the Lord." But he said to them, "Unless I see in His hands the print of the nails, and place my finger in the mark of the nails, and place my hand in His side, I will not believe."

Eight days later, His disciples were again in the house, and Thomas was with them. The doors were shut, but Jesus came and stood among them, and said, "Peace be with you." Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here, and see My hands; and put out your hand, and place it in My side; do not be faithless, but believing." Thomas answered Him, "My Lord and my God!" Jesus said to him, "Have you believed because you have seen Me? Blessed are those who have not seen and yet believe."

Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of the disciples, which are not written in this book; but these are written that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that believing you may have life in His Name.

HOLY COMMUNION

In the Orthodox Church, the sacrament of Communion is offered only to Christians who are baptized in the name of the Trinity and chrismated into the Orthodox Faith. Non-Orthodox believers are invited to approach the chalice for a blessing and the blessed bread instead of the Eucharist.

So that the priest is aware of this, please just say, "Father, bless" when you get to the chalice.

At the end of the dismissal prayer the service then continues with the typical Paschal dialogue, as follows:



Your Life

GRAB AND GO

A 'go bag' can make all the difference in an emergency. Here's how to be ready to run at a moment's notice

BASIC ELECTRONICS

Pack an extra phone charger in case you're fortunate enough to have electricity, and a portable battery pack in case you're not. Also stash a long-lasting LED flashlight. Pack a small hand-cranked or battery-operated AM/FM radio (with extra batteries).

PERSONAL NEEDS

While getting ready for a typical day, list every toiletry you use, then buy a travel-size version of each. Pack backup eyeglasses, as well as a first-aid kit, baby wipes and a multipurpose tool with a knife and can opener.



Pack a few days' worth. Include layers you can add or remove, plus lightweight rain gear and waterproof boots.

Pack about three days' worth of each of your prescriptions. If you need larger items, such as an oxygen tank, make sure you have a portable version.

THE PERFECT BAG

Think small and portable. A backpack is ideal, but a lightweight suitcase with wheels will also do. Just remember, you may literally be running with it.

marriage, adoption or naturalization certificates: proof of address; insurance, medical and immunization records; and information about your credit and

ATM cards.

Bottled water is essential. Granola or energy bars are great because they are small and filling, and they come in a variety of flavors.

CASH

In addition to enough money for a few days, include small bills and a roll of quarters. If you need to buy something out of a vending machine, you don't want to start asking equally desperate strangers for change.

ecent natural catastrophes, from hurricanes to western wildfires, are a fresh reminder that disaster can strike at any time. And no area of the country is immune, when you factor in the threat of tornadoes, earthquakes and human disasters like toxic spills. While the circumstances may differ, there's one tip that every person needs to take from all these situations: how to pack a "go bag."

A go bag is a packed case that you grab on your way out the door, and that will help keep you safe and comfortable in the coming hours and days. Stopping to hunt for your medications or other important needs can cost you critical seconds in an evacuation.

Pack a separate go bag for yourself and every member of your household, and keep them stored in the same location.

I've interviewed hundreds of disaster victims, and compiled their recommendations in the graphic above.

Jeff Rossen of NBC News is the author of new survival and fraud-fighting book Rossen to the Rescue.

EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS

In the next several months, we will be working with a professional company called Hytropy that has offered to help us develop an emergency preparedness plan for the parish. They are doing this at no charge.

The plan will include instructions for a variety of natural disasters and other circumstances. There will also be some training provided and we will conduct a few different types of drills.

Hytropy is also able to help us purchase (at a discount) personal or family emergency kits similar to (but not exactly like) the one in the article to the left. We will have several sample kits for you to look at and we will take orders through the church. Each family will be asked to pay for their own kits.

Stay tuned for more details as we continue to move forward on this.
