

CHANGEABLE TEXTS FOR THE DAY

THE PRAISES for the Leave-taking of the Feast of the Cross

At the end of Matins the choir will sing the 3 stichera of the Praises for the Leave-taking of the Feast of the Cross

Verse 5. Praise Him with the timbrel and dance; praise Him with stringed instruments and organs.

Oh, most glorious wonder! The life-bearing tree, the all-holy Cross today is raised up on high and shown to the world. All the ends of the earth give glory; all the demons are struck with terror. Oh, what a gift is bestowed on mortals. Through the Cross, save our souls, O Christ, as You alone are compassionate!

Verse 6. Praise Him upon the loud cymbals: praise Him upon the high-sounding cymbals. Let everything that hath breath praise the Lord.

Oh, most glorious wonder! The cross that carried the Most High like a cluster of grapes filled with life today is seen raised up above the earth. Through this we have all been drawn to God, and death is finally swallowed up. O, immaculate Wood! Through you we enjoy the immortal food of Eden as we give glory to Christ!

- Verse 7. Exalt ye the Lord our God and worship at His footstool.
- Vs. 8. As for God, He is our King before the ages.

O, most glorious wonder! The length and breadth of the Cross is equal to heaven, for by divine grace it sanctifies the universe. By the Cross, pagan nations are overcome. By the Cross the sceptres of kings are firmly established. O divine ladder, by which we go up to heaven, exalting the Lord in song!

Glory to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit; now and ever and unto ages of ages. Amen.

Doxastikon at the Praises (for the Feast of the Cross) Tone 6

Today the Cross of the Lord comes forth; the faithful welcome it with longing and receive healing of soul and body and of infirmity. Let us kiss it with joy and fear: fear because of our sin, since we are unworthy, but joy because of the salvation given to the world by Christ the Lord Who was nailed upon it, Who has great mercy.

AT THE END OF THE MATINS SERVICE, WE SING THE GREAT DOXOLOGY.

("Glory to You, Who have shown us the light..." - Complete text is in the front of the Liturgy Book.)

The Doxology is followed by the Matins Dismissal Troparion.

Vs. O God, my God, attend to me; why hast Thou forsaken me? Far from my salvation are the words of my transgressions.


Refrain: Through the intercessions of the Theotokos, O Savior, save us.

- Vs. My God, I will cry by day, and wilt Thou not hearken? But as for Thee, Thou dwellest in the sanctuary, O Praise of Israel. [**Refrain**]

Second Antiphon verses for the Feast of the Cross & refrain

Vs. O God, why hast Thou cast us off unto the end? Remember Thy congregation which Thou hast purchased from the beginning.





- Vs. This is Mount Zion wherein Thou hast dwelt. [Refrain]
- VS. God is our King before the ages, He hath wrought salvation in the midst of the earth. [Refrain]

Glory to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit, now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

Only Begotten Son and immortal Word of God who for our salvation didst will to be incarnate of the holy Theotokos and ever-virgin Mary, who without change didst become man and wast crucified, O Christ our God, trampling down death by death, who art one of the Holy Trinity, glorified with the Father and the Holy Spirit: save us!

EPISTLE READING Galatians 2:16-20

Brethren, you know that a man is not justified by works of the Law, but through faith in Jesus Christ. Even we have believed in Christ Jesus, in order to be justified by faith in Christ, and not by works of the Law, because by works of the Law shall no one be justified. But if, in our endeavor to be justified in Christ, we ourselves were found to be sinners, is Christ then an agent of sin? Certainly not! But if I build up again those things, which I tore down, then I prove myself a transgressor. For I through the Law died to the Law, that I might live to God. I have been crucified with Christ; it is no longer I who live, but Christ who lives in me; and the life I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave Himself for me.

For what can a man give in return for his soul? And He said to them, "Truly, I say to you, there are some standing here who will not taste death before they see the kingdom of God come with power."

LITURGY OF THE FAITHFUL

The following changeable hymns for the feast are sung after the Anaphora:

Meglynarion (Hymn to the Mother of God) for the feast of the Cross (Tone 8 Byzantine melody, arranged by Max Murphy of Indianapolis, IN)

You are a mystical paradise, O Birthgiver of God, in which Christ blossomed. Through Him, the life-bearing wood of the Cross was planted on earth. Now, at its elevation, as we bow in worship before it, we glorify You.

Hymns sung as the clergy receive the Eucharist for the feast of the Cross

Praise the Lord from the heavens, praise Him in the highest! (Ps 148:1) The light of Your countenance has shone on us, O Lord. (Ps 4/5:6) Alleluia (3x)

Instead of "We have seen the true light," we sing the Troparion of the Feast.

O Lord save Thy people and bless Thine inheritance, granting victory over all adversaries. And by the pow'r of Thy cross protect us.

Hello St. Athanasius Parish Family,

September 2014

We are still living in and working in Khamis Mushayt, Saudi Arabia, which is in the extreme southwest of SA near Yemen. Our weather here is spectacular. Never very hot or cold. Our home is on a guarded compound, specifically for westerners. This allows us to walk freely, (especially Monica) outside without having to wear the traditional Saudi garb. When we go off compound, she wears a black Abaya, which covers her completely, like a robe. She doesn't wear anything over her face, but will occasionally wear a head cover. Phil's isn't required to wear anything special.



Phil's job is to drive about 160 km each way to a military aircraft bombing range, where he is responsible for the safe operation of the range. This includes controlling all aircraft while they are expending their munitions for practice. In this capacity, he works with military and civilians from about 8 different countries. Driving is for males only here and is extremely crazy and dangerous. However, this time is well spent listening to books, both for entertainment and business and Orthodox podcasts.

Phil has recently published his third book, a cookbook, and had his first book translated into Spanish, for sale on Amazon. Traveling is our reprieve for the very strange life here. We have been able to see some extremely interesting and varied places this year, including Jamaica and the Caribbean, Turkey, Italy, Greece, Nepal and Ethiopia. Two trips remain for the year, France and England. We plan on returning home for a brief visit in January.

We miss our Church more than you can imagine, but are able to have our prayer and icon area for our daily prayers. Please keep us in your prayers as we do you.


Prayer requests in the bulletin are prayed out loud during the deacons' litanies and should be submitted to the church office—office@stathanasius.org.
