#### **HOLY COMMUNION**

In the Orthodox Church, the sacrament of Communion is offered only to Orthodox Christians who have prepared to receive. Non-Orthodox believers and others **may approach the chalice for a blessing and the blessed bread instead of the Eucharist.** So that the priest is aware of this, please just say, "Father, bless" when you get to the chalice.

# At the conclusion of Matins, we sing the Great Doxology followed by the Matins Dismissal Troparion.

#### FIRST ANTIPHON—Psalm verses with refrain

Vs. It is good to give praise unto the Lord, and to chant unto Thy name, O Most High; To proclaim Thy mercy in the morning, and Thy truth by night. [Refrain]

#### Refrain: Through the intercessions of the Theotokos, O Savior, save us.

- Vs. Upright is the Lord our God, and there is no unrighteousness in Him. [Refrain]

#### **EPISTLE READING**

(For the Sunday of the Last Judgement)

1 Corinthians 8:8-9:2

Brethren, food will not commend us to God. We are no worse off if we do not eat, and no better off if we do. Only take care, lest this liberty of yours somehow become a stumbling block to the weak. For if any one sees you—a man of knowledge—at table in an idol's temple, might he not be encouraged, if his conscience is weak, to eat food offered to idols? And so by your knowledge this weak man is destroyed, the brother for whom Christ died. Thus, sinning against your brethren and wounding their conscience when it is weak, you sin against Christ. Therefore, if food is a cause of my brother's falling, I will never eat meat, lest I cause my brother to fall. Am I not free? Am I not an apostle? Have I not seen Jesus our Lord? Are not you my workmanship in the Lord? If to others I am not an apostle, at least I am to you; for you are the seal of my apostleship in the Lord.

#### THE GOSPEL READING

(For Sunday of the Last Judgment)

#### The Reading from the Holy Gospel according to St. Matthew. (25:31-46)

The Lord said, "When the Son of man comes in His glory, and all the angels with Him, then He will sit on His glorious throne. Before Him will be gathered all the nations, and He will separate them one from another as a shepherd separates the sheep from the goats, and He will place the sheep at His right hand, but the goats at the left. Then the King will say to those at His right hand, 'Come, O blessed of my Father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world; for I was hungry and you gave Me food, I was thirsty and you gave Me drink, I was a stranger and you welcomed Me, I was naked and you clothed Me, I was sick and you visited Me, I was in prison and you came to Me.' Then the righteous will answer Him, 'Lord, when did we see Thee hungry and feed Thee, or thirsty and give Thee drink? And when did we see Thee a stranger and welcome Thee, or naked and clothe Thee? And when did we see Thee sick or in prison and visit Thee?' And the King will answer them, 'Truly, I say to you, as you did it to one of the least of these My brethren, you did it to Me.' Then He will say to those at his left hand, 'Depart from Me, you cursed, into the eternal fire prepared for the devil and his angels; for I was hungry and you gave Me no food, I was thirsty and you gave Me no drink, I was a stranger and you did not welcome Me, naked and you did not clothe Me, sick and in prison and you did not visit Me.' Then they also will answer, 'Lord, when did we see Thee hungry or thirsty or a stranger or naked or sick or in prison, and did not minister to Thee?' Then He will answer them, 'Truly, I say to you, as you did it not to one of the least of these, you did it not to Me.' And they will go away into eternal punishment, but the righteous into eternal life."

## On Meatfare Sunday

from Great Lent by Fr. Alexander Schmemann

Christian love is the "possible impossibility" to see Christ in another man, whoever he is, and whom God, in His eternal and mysterious plan, has decided to introduce into my life, be it only for a few moments, not as an occasion for a "good deed" or an exercise in philanthropy, but as the beginning of an eternal companionship in God Himself. For, indeed, what is love if not that mysterious power which transcends the accidental and the external in the "other"-- his physical appearance, social rank, ethnic origin, intellectual capacity-- and reaches the *soul*, the unique and uniquely personal "root" of a human being, truly the part of God in him? If God loves every man it is because He alone knows the priceless and absolutely unique treasure, the "soul" or "person" He gave every man. Christian love then is the participation in that divine knowledge and the gift of that divine love. There is no "impersonal" love because love *is* the wonderful discovery of the "person" in "man," of the personal and unique in the common and general. "Each of you should give what you have decided in your heart to give, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver" (2 Corinthians 9:7)

Beloved Brother Hierarchs, Reverend Clergy, and Christ-Loving Faithful of this God-Protected Archdiocese,

Blessings to you and your families in the Name of our Lord, God, and Savior Jesus Christ!

Our Lord said, "Amen, I say to you: insofar as you did it for one of the least of these my brothers, you did it for me" (Matt. 25:40). Clothing the naked, feeding the hungry, welcoming the stranger, visiting those sick or in prison—all these acts of kindness toward others are received by Christ as an expression of love toward Him, when they are undertaken cheerfully. These words of the gospel are read in church on the Sunday of the Last Judgment in order to focus our attention on such acts of charity during this holy season. They call us to rededicate ourselves now to this Christian lifestyle of giving, which should characterize our lives throughout the year.

What a privilege it is to serve Christ Himself in the needy! In fact, every one of us is in need of the mercy of God. Christ identified Himself with the weak, the poor, and the miserable and with those who could not provide themselves with the necessities of life, so it is Him we serve in every human being, and it is Him who, in us, serves those who need to be served. This is how we live our "Royal Priesthood," delivering our lives to Him so that we may experience the mystery of His sacrifice, for Christ Himself is "He that offereth and is offered, that accepteth and is distributed" (The Prayer of the Cherubic Hymn).

The mystery of giving and sacrifice lies in our acceptance to God's Love, which we express by complying with the commandment, "My son, give me your heart" (Prov. 23:26). Giving God our hearts means giving Him everything—all our being. When we give Him our hearts, He gives us Himself through His Holy Spirit and dwells in our hearts with His unoriginated Father, "so that God may be all in all" (1 Cor. 15:28). Then we will experience how "in everyone it is the same God at work" (1 Cor. 12:6) and will acknowledge that in Christ we become what we give; in other words, we should be the food given—in Christ, to and through Him—to console the hearts of those who seek it.

As we have throughout the past 49 years, we now encourage you to provide help for the needy through the Food for Hungry People program during Lent. We appeal to your generosity and your love of God, asking you to offer Christ this token of your gratitude for His kindness to us. We know that He will receive it as a precious gift and cherish it.

With prayers that God will strengthen us all in this holy struggle of Lent and that we will be found worthy to celebrate joyously the Resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ, I remain,
