HOLY COMMUNION

In the Orthodox Church, the sacrament of Communion is offered only to Orthodox Christians who have prepared to receive. Non-Orthodox believers and others **may approach the chalice for a blessing and the blessed bread instead of the Eucharist.** So that the priest is aware of this, please just say, "Father, bless" when you get to the chalice.

At the conclusion of Matins, we sing the Great Doxology followed by the Matins Dismissal Troparion

Refrain: Through the intercessions of the Theotokos, O Savior, save us!

THE EPISTLE READING for PENTECOST Acts 2:1-11

When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place. And suddenly a sound came from heaven like the rush of a mighty wind, and it filled all the house where they were sitting. And there appeared to them tongues as of fire, distributed and resting on each one of them. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues, as the Spirit gave them utterance.

Now there were dwelling in Jerusalem Jews, devout men from every nation under heaven. And at this sound the multitude came together, and they were bewildered, because each one heard them speaking in his own language. And they were amazed and wondered, saying, "Are not all these who are speaking Galileans? And how is it that we hear, each of us in his own native language? Parthians and Medes and Elamites and residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya belonging to Cyrene, and visitors from Rome, both Jews and proselytes, Cretans and Arabians, we hear them telling in our own tongues the mighty works of God."

THE GOSPEL READING for PENTECOST John 7:37-52, 8:12

On the last day of the feast, the great day, Jesus stood up and proclaimed, "If anyone thirst, let him come to Me and drink. He who believes in Me, as the Scripture has said, 'Out of his belly shall flow rivers of living water." Now this He said about the Spirit, which those who believed in Him were to receive; for as yet the Spirit had not been given, because Jesus was not yet glorified.

When they heard these words, many of the people said, "This is really the prophet." Others said, "This is the Christ." But some said, "Is the Christ to come from Galilee? Has not the Scripture said that the Christ is descended from David, and comes from Bethlehem, the village where David was?" So there was a division among the people over Him. Some of them wanted to arrest Him, but no one laid hands on Him.

The officers then went back to the chief priests and Pharisees, who said to them, "Why did you not bring Him?" The officers answered, "No man ever spoke like this man!" The Pharisees answered them, "Are you led astray, you also? Have any of the authorities or of the Pharisees believed in Him? But this crowd, who do not know the Law, are accursed." Nicodemus, who had gone to Him before, and who was one of them, said to them, "Does our Law judge a man without first giving him a hearing and learning what he does?" They replied, "Are you from Galilee too? Search and you will see that no prophet is to rise from Galilee."

Again Jesus spoke to them, saying, "I am the light of the world; he who follows Me will not walk in darkness, but will have the light of life."

HYMN TO THE MOTHER OF GOD (Meglynarion)

9th Ode of the Canon for Pentecost:

Rejoice, O Queen, glory of mothers and virgins! No tongue, however sweet or fluent, is eloquent enough to praise you worthily. Every mind is overawed by your childbearing. Therefore, with one voice, we glorify you.

COMMUNION HYMN

Let Your good Spirit lead me on a level path. Alleluia, Alleluia, Alleluia. (Psalm 143)

Instead of "We have seen the true light, we sing the <u>Troparion for Pentecost.</u>

At the end of the Liturgy, we will say the **Kneeling Prayers of Pentecost**. Between Pascha and Pentecost, the Church proscribes no kneeling during services as we celebrate the joy of the Resurrection for 40 days. With these prayers, we resume kneeling in the church. We also resume saying "**O Heavenly King**" in our daily prayers and in the Trisagion Prayers in our services.

Thanksgiving Prayers after Communion

At the end of the Divine Liturgy, we offer the prayers of thanksgiving for having received the Body and Blood of Christ. These beautiful prayers help us to reflect on the mystery in which we have just partaken, and prepare us for our transition back into the "world." We invite you to listen to these beautiful prayers during and after the veneration of the cross at the end of the service, and <u>ask that you show courtesy to those who are remaining to hear the prayers in their entirety by waiting until the blessing of the food at Coffee Hour to eat and socialize.</u>

The Celebration - An Invitation from the Children of Atria Levels II and III -

Today, Pentecost Sunday, we invite you to "ask that you might receive" . . .

As you enter the nave of the church, you will receive a taper candle.

At the back of the nave, there will be a table with seven green candles—each labeled with one of the gifts of the Holy Spirit:

- Wisdom
- Understanding
- Counsel
- Might
- Knowledge
- Fear of the Lord
- Delight

We invite you to **light your own candle from the green candle designating the gift you have chosen** and place your candle in the sand in front of that green candle.

Once you have lit and placed your taper candle, we will give you a **handmade card with the name of the gift and a description** on it. Hopefully this will sit on your home altar or some other prominent place to remind you all year long of the gift you have asked for!

PARISH COUNCIL CORNER

Temple Fund

We began paying our entire monthly mortgage out of our General Operating Budget in January of this year. Previously, over half of the monthly mortgage payment came from the Building Fund. The former Building Fund is now the Temple Fund which, as of May 15, 2022, had a balance of \$176,116. These funds are now restricted solely for building the new temple. The Parish Council has received a blessing from Metropolitan Joseph to have an "official" Temple Fund specifically to hold funds for the building of the Temple and on which we will not have to tithe 10% to the Archdiocese. Please check the thermometer sign in the narthex for Temple Fund progress.

Warming Kitchen

Progress on the warming kitchen has been delayed due to supply chain issues and shipping delays. We are awaiting delivery of stainless steel countertops and shelves. The estimated shipping date is June 22. There is currently no delivery date for the shipment of the remaining supplies needed to complete the kitchen.

SAOC Street Sign

The Parish Council approved the funds to refurbish the large sign that faces Hollister Avenue on the front of the church property. The icon of St. Athanasius is now clear and the sign is more visible.

Lighting Repair in the Nave and Hallway

The Parish Council approved the cost for the lighting upgrades and replacements of the ceiling lights in the nave and the hallway. Jim Morrison will volunteer his time to complete the work. Thank you, Jim, for your time and effort!

Sound System Upgrade

We just received the final part needed for the sound system upgrade! It was ordered in November 2021, but delayed due to supply chain issues. The installation of the new speakers will be done in conjunction with the lighting repairs in order to reduce the cost of renting a lift, which will be needed for both projects.

Policy for Use of Church Facilities

A committee authorized by the Parish Council has worked diligently over the past year to develop a detailed policy for use of the church building, grounds and patio. Rental of the parish facilities is restricted to active parish members in good standing. We now have a Facilities Use Policy approved by the Parish Council, and a process in place. This policy, along with a number of other policies which have been created or revised in the past two years and approved by the Parish Council, will be posted to the "Parishioners-Only" section of the parish website. Many thanks to those who have worked on this project or who consulted with the committee: Laurie Baker, Terri Speier, Zak Landrum, Valerie Yova, Jami Stetler, and Christie Speier.
