

#### **HOLY COMMUNION**

In the Orthodox Church, the sacrament of Communion is offered only to Orthodox Christians who have prepared to receive. Non-Orthodox believers and others **may approach the chalice for a blessing and the blessed bread instead of the Eucharist.** So that the priest is aware of this, please just say, "Father, bless" when you get to the chalice.

## At the conclusion of Matins, we sing the Great Doxology followed by the Matins Dismissal Troparion

#### **GREAT LITANY**

#### FIRST ANTIPHON verses for the feast of the Nativity of the Theotokos with refrain:

Vs. O Lord, remember David and all his meekness. Lo, we heard of it at Ephratha; we found it in the fields of the wood.

Refrain: Through the intercessions of the Theotokos, O Savior, save us.

- Vs. Glorious things are spoken of thee, O city of God. God is in the midst of her; she shall not be moved. [Refrain]
- Vs. Glory...now & ever...Amen. [Refrain]

#### SECOND ANTIPHON verses for the feast of the Nativity of the Theotokos & refrain

Vs. The Lord hath sworn in truth unto David; and He will not turn from it. Of the fruit of thy body will I set upon thy throne.

Refrain: O Son of God, Who rose from the dead, save us who sing to Thee, Alleluia!

- Vs. There will I make the horn of David to bud; I have ordained a lamp for mine anointed. [Refrain]
- Vs. For the Lord hath chosen Zion; He hath desired it for His habitation. [Refrain]

Glory to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit, now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

**Only Begotten Son** and immortal Word of God who for our salvation didst will to be incarnate of the holy Theotokos and ever virgin Mary, who without change didst become man and wast crucified, O Christ our God, trampling down death by death, who art one of the Holy Trinity, glorified with the Father and the Holy Spirit: save us!

#### THE EPISTLE READING for the Sunday before the Feast of the Cross Galatians 6:11-18

Brethren, see with what large letters I am writing to you with my own hand. It is those who want to make a good showing in the flesh that would compel you to be circumcised and only in order that they may not be persecuted for the cross of Christ. For even those who receive circumcision do not themselves keep the Law, but they desire to have you circumcised that they may glory in your flesh. But far be it from me to glory except in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, by which the world has been crucified to me and I to the world.

For, neither circumcision counts for anything, nor uncircumcision, but a new creation. Peace and mercy be upon all, who walk by this rule, upon the Israel of God. Henceforth let no man trouble me; for I bear on my body the marks of Jesus. The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ be with your spirit, brethren. Amen.

## GOSPEL READING for the Sunday before the Feast of the Cross John 3:13-17

The Lord said, "No one has ascended into heaven but He who descended from heaven, the Son of man. And as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, so must the Son of man be lifted up, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have eternal life. For God so loved the world that He gave His only Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have eternal life. For, God sent His Son into the world, not to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through Him."

#### Meglynarion for the Nativity of the Theotokos (Hymn to the Mother of God)

Magnify, O my soul, the Virgin Mary, born of a barren womb. Virginity is foreign to mothers; Childbearing is strange to virgins. But in you, O birthgiver of God, both were accomplished. Therefore, all the earthly nations unceasingly glorify You.

#### **Communion Hymn**

At the end of the Divine Liturgy, we offer the prayers of thanksgiving for having received the Body and Blood of Christ. These beautiful prayers help us to reflect on the mystery in which we have just partaken, and prepare us for our transition back into the "world." We invite you to listen to these beautiful prayers during and after the veneration of the cross at the end of the service, and <u>ask that you show courtesy to those who are remaining to hear the prayers in their entirety by waiting until the blessing of the food at Coffee Hour to eat and socialize.</u>



## SUNDAY MORNING AGAPE MEAL

This fall we will be making a slight shift in how we think about and organize our fellowship time after the Divine Liturgy. Active parish members received an e-mail last week from Fr. Symeon explaining this shift.



In the early church, after worshipping together, the Christians would share a meal together, referred to as

the "Agape Meal." The "breaking of bread" which takes place after the Divine Liturgy is an important extension of the union we experience in the Eucharist.

Modeling the spirit of this meal, we will be shifting away from coffee and snacks to a simple meal on most Sunday, during which we can share fellowship, provide hospitality to visitors, and nurture a spirit of generosity and service in the parish.
