GREAT LITANY

FIRST ANTIPHON—Psalm verses with refrain

- Vs. It is good to give praise unto the Lord, and to chant unto Thy name, O Most High; To proclaim Thy mercy in the morning, and Thy truth by night. [Refrain]
 - Refrain: Through the intercessions of the Theotokos, O Savior, save us.
- Vs. Upright is the Lord our God, and there is no unrighteousness in Him. [Refrain]
- Vs. Glory...now & ever...Amen. [Refrain]

SECOND ANTIPHON—Psalm verses with refrain

Vs. The Lord is King, He is clothed with majesty; the Lord is clothed with strength and hath girded Himself.

Refrain: O Son Of God Who rose from the dead, save us who sing to Thee, Alleluia!

- Vs. For He hath established the world which shall not be shaken. [Refrain]
- Vs. Holiness befits Thy house, O Lord, forevermore. [Refrain]

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

Only begotten Son and immortal Word of God, who for our salvation didst will to be incarnate of the Holy Theotokos and ever-virgin Mary, who without change didst become man and was crucified, O Christ our God, trampling down death by death, who art one of the Holy Trinity, glorified with the Father and the Holy Spirit: save us.

Holy Communion

In the Orthodox Church, the Sacrament of Communion is offered only to Orthodox Christians who have humbly prepared to receive through prayer, fasting, and a recent Sacramental Confession.

Non-Orthodox people and those not communing today may approach during Communion for a priestly blessing by saying, "Father, bless." After this you may take a piece of antidoron (blessed bread) offered in the bowls.

If you are interested in joining the One Holy Catholic and Apostolic Church, speak with our Pastor about how to become an Orthodox Christian.



FR. SYMEON WILL BE AWAY October 10—11 at the Diocesan Fall Gathering.

SUNDAY RELIGIOUS EDUCATION CLASSES BEGIN TODAY. The Catechesis of the Good Shepherd for children ages 3 yrs through 6th grade will meet at 9:00 a.m. The teens will meet immediately following the Eucharist. All children and teens need to be REGISTERED by a parent or guardian by the first session they attend.

OCTOBER IS YOUTH & SEMINARIAN MONTH. Our Archdiocese currently has 22 students enrolled in seminary. We will learn how to free up our singing voices with some simple vocal exercises and we will sing through some basic responses, (like "Lord have mercies") liturgical hymns for the upcoming Nativity feast, and some Christmas carols. Folks of all ages are welcome! If there is a significant show of interest, the sessions will continue.

ADULT CATECHISM

Adult Catechism classes began on September 21st and will meet from 12:45—1:15 P.M. every Sunday until the beginning of Great Lent, with a few exceptions. All are welcome, whether inquirers, catechumens, or long-time members of the parish.

WOMEN'S FALL BOOK STUDY


Our Women's Fellowship invites you to join us for a new book study this October!


