HOLY COMMUNION

In the Orthodox Church, the sacrament of Communion is offered only to Christians who are baptized in the name of the Trinity and chrismated into the Orthodox Faith. Non-Orthodox believers **may approach the chalice for a blessing and the blessed bread instead of the Eucharist.** So that the priest is aware of this, please just say,

"Father, bless" when you get to the chalice.

At the conclusion of Matins, we sing the Great Doxology followed by the Matins Dismissal Troparion:

THE DIVINE LITURGY OF ST. JOHN CHRYSOSTOM

GREAT LITANY

FIRST ANTIPHON—Psalm verses with refrain

Vs. It is good to give praise unto the Lord, and to chant unto Thy name, O Most High; To proclaim Thy mercy in the morning, and Thy truth by night. [Refrain]

Refrain: Through the intercessions of the Theotokos, O Savior, save us.

- Vs. Upright is the Lord our God, and there is no unrighteousness in Him. [Refrain]
- Vs. Glory...now & ever...Amen. [Refrain]

SECOND ANTIPHON—Psalm verses with refrain

Vs. The Lord is King, He is clothed with majesty; the Lord is clothed with strength and hath girded Himself.

Refrain: O Son Of God Who rose from the dead, save us who sing to Thee, Alleluia!

- Vs. For He hath established the world which shall not be shaken. [Refrain]
- Vs. Holiness befits Thy house, O Lord, forevermore. [Refrain]

Glory to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit; Now and ever and unto ages of ages. Amen. **Only Begotten Son** and immortal Word of God who for our salvation didst will to be incarnate of the holy Theotokos and ever virgin Mary, who without change didst become man and wast crucified, O Christ our God, trampling down death by death, who art one of the Holy Trinity, glorified with the Father and the Holy Spirit: save us!

EPISTLE READING Corinthians.4:9-16

Brethren, God has revealed us, the apostles, last of all, as those appointed to death; for we have become a spectacle to the world, both to angels and to men. We are fools for Christ's sake, but you are wise in Christ; we are weak, but you are strong; you are glorified, but we are dishonored. At that time, a lawyer stood up to put Jesus to the test, saying, "Teacher, what shall I do to inherit eternal life?" Jesus said to him, "What is written in the Law? How do you read?" And the lawyer answered, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your strength, and with all your mind; and your neighbor as yourself." And Jesus said to him, "You have answered right; do this, and you will live." But the lawyer, desiring to justify himself, said to Jesus, "And who is my neighbor?" Jesus replied, "A man was going down from Jerusalem to Jericho, and he fell among robbers, who stripped him and beat him, and departed, leaving him half dead. Now by chance a priest was going down that road; and when he saw him he passed by on the other side. So likewise a Levite, when he came to the place and saw him, passed by on the other side. But a Samaritan, as he journeyed, came to where he was; and when he saw him, he had compassion, and went to him and bound up his wounds, pouring on oil and wine; then he set him on his own beast and brought him to an inn, and took care of him. And the next day he took out two denarii and gave them to the innkeeper, saying, 'Take care of him; and whatever more you spend, I will repay you when I come back.' Which of these three, do you think, proved neighbor to the man who fell among the robbers?" The lawyer said, "The one who showed mercy on him." And Jesus said to him, "Go and do likewise."

MINISTRY TEAM GOALS for 2021-22 per Meeting of Ministry Leaders on 10/23/21

- **Parish Council** Define the role of the Parish Council more clearly. Make sure we take care of the needs in maintaining our current building.
- Music Ministry Continue to rebuild the choir after 16 months of singing in very small ensembles due to the pandemic. (Recruit a few more adults and a few teens.) Continue to build chanting teams and increase skill level and confidence in chanters for weekday services.
- **Acolytes** Schedule more training sessions and recruit more young adults and adults to assist in the altar.
- Handmaidens (NEW MINISTRY) We just received a blessing from Metropolitan Joseph to move forward with organizing a group of girls and young women who will have a liturgical ministry that will include caring for the nave of the church before, during, and after services, and participating liturgically in a variety of ways. Margaret Easbey is working with Fr. Symeon to get this ministry up and running.
- St. Xenia Prayer Ministry Communicate the message to the parishioners that their prayer requests are welcome, and that we are ALL being prayed for every week. All are welcome to join us on Wednesdays at Noon in the chapel.
- Youth Group -- Help our teens learn what it takes to become an adult, separate from their parents. Help them learn how to establish a spiritual discipline.
- Young Adults Gauge interest and offer monthly activities, alternating between structured discussion and informal social opportunities.
- Parish Library-- Recruit a few more volunteers for the team.
- **Building Maintenance** Keep up with the growing need for maintenance of our existing building.
- Catechesis of the Good Shepherd Host a national training conference for Orthodox catechists.
- **Festal Decorating** Establish a stable team of talented people. (Goal was accomplished in the past month!)
- Showers of Blessing Recruit a few new volunteers to replace those who have had to step down. (Showers are Thursday mornings 10:00 am. 1:00 p.m.)
- **Evangelism** Continue to utilize the website for communicating who we are as Orthodox Christians; Expand the Sunday Greeters Program.

- **Icon Guild** -- Finish the three diptychs for our priests to carry with them when visiting those in need. We will continue to meet two days each month to work together and introduce others to iconography.
- Coffee Hour Help everyone on the team to understand the importance of the ministry, and to work as a team to support the weekly hosts as much as possible.
- **Social/Celebrations** Focus on the larger events and form committees to coordinate them. (Pascha, Pentecost, St. Nicholas)
- Men's Fellowship Add more small groups/options for our men to participate in addition to once-a-month Saturday morning breakfast/prayer/book study, and once-a-month Fireside. More variety of activities, more holistic.
- Women's Fellowship Offer a variety of opportunities and experiences to support our women in deepening their spiritual growth (make us stronger warriors for Christ); Develop deeper relationships with each other in order to build a more loving family.
- Meals for New Moms -- Recruit someone to take over leadership of this ministry.
- Wedding Service Coordinators Continue smooth transition of new leadership from Penny Brunner to Christie Robinson and Lara Jacobs.
- St. Lucia Visitation Communicate to our parishioners that they can let us know when there is a need for meals or phone calls to offer encouragement.
- **Pre-marital Counseling** Set some new goals for how to expand this ministry, including follow-up with couples after the weddings.
- Landscaping Keep us connected to the area where the temple will be built. Maybe add some landscaping and seating around the cross out in the field, make it a peaceful place to sit and pray. Make it a pleasant destination rather than just a cross out in the field.
- **Photography** Complete new photo directory in early 2022; Visit those who are home bound to take photos for the parish photo directory, if they would welcome that.
- Orthodox Christians for Life Support and participate in more local activities.
