GREAT LITANY

FIRST ANTIPHON—Psalm verses with refrain

Vs. It is good to give praise unto the Lord, and to chant unto Thy name, O Most High; To proclaim Thy mercy in the morning, and Thy truth by night. [Refrain]

Refrain: Through the intercessions of the Theotokos, O Savior, save us.

EPISTLE READING Galatians 2:16-20

Brethren, you know that a man is not justified by works of the Law but through faith in Jesus Christ. Even we have believed in Christ Jesus, in order to be justified by faith in Christ, and not by works of the Law, because by works of the Law shall no one be justified. But if, in our endeavor to be justified in Christ, we ourselves were found to be sinners, is Christ then an agent of sin? Certainly not! But if I build up again those things which I tore down, then I prove myself a transgressor. For I through the Law died to the Law, that I might live to God. I have been crucified with Christ; it is no longer I who live, but Christ Who lives in me; and the life I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the Son of God, Who loved me and gave Himself for me.

This night your soul is required of you; and the things you have prepared, whose will they be?' So is he who lays up treasure for himself, and is not rich toward God." As He said this, Jesus called out, "He who has ears to hear, let him hear."

Holy Communion & The Thanksgiving Prayers

In the Orthodox Church, the Sacrament of Communion is offered only to Orthodox Christians who have humbly prepared to receive through prayer and a recent Sacramental Confession.

Non-Orthodox people and those not communing today may approach during Communion for a priestly blessing by saying, "Father, bless." After this you may take a piece of antidoron (blessed bread) offered in the bowls.

If you are interested in joining the One Holy Catholic and Apostolic Church, speak with our Pastor about how to become an Orthodox Christian.

At the conclusion of the Divine Liturgy, we offer **Thanksgiving Prayers** for having received the body and blood of Christ. These beautiful prayers help us to reflect on the mystery in which we have partaken and prepare us for our transition from the Kingdom back into "the world." If you have partaken, stay to listen to these prayers after you have venerated the cross. Immediately after, the priest will bless the Agape Meal. **We ask that all your socializing take place outside of the church.**

PARISH COUNCIL CORNER

• Drinking Fountain

The red light on the drinking fountain in the hallway can be disregarded. The fountain is connected to a large, reverse-osmosis filter in the wall, which is much more effective than the filter built into the fountain and lasts much longer. The smaller one in the fountain is programmed to light up after a certain number of gallons of water have been used as a reminder to change the filter.

• Baby High Chairs

We have approved the purchase of several high chairs to be used during the Agape Meal for infants and toddlers. We ask that the parents using them be responsible for wiping them down and putting them away when finished with them. The chairs will be purchased within the next few months.

• St. Peter the Aleut Teen & Education Room

We have finished remodeling the Teen and Education Room, including a large table, chairs, a built-in storage cabinet, refrigerator, wall-mounted flat screen, freshly painted walls, and an icon wall. Our Level III Catechesis will be using this room as their atrium on Sunday mornings this year. Ministry teams can schedule use of the room through the church office for meetings, study groups and other gatherings.

On Sunday, December 8th, all of the cards will be put on the altar table during the Liturgy as an "offering," and we will pray that our commitments for the coming year will be blessed. Commitment Cards will be collected each week from the tithe box until 9:45 a.m. on Sunday, December 8th and all will be presented that day as an offering.

What is Stewardship? Why is it important?

Stewardship supports the Orthodox Christian practice of consistent, cheerful and purposeful giving of **time**, **talent** and **treasure** in support of our Church and its ministries to help further the word and teachings of Jesus Christ. On a personal level, it supports and showcases a life being lived in Christ.

Stewardship creates and fosters a spirit of generosity and giving for the Glory of God. When we are generous and give freely of our time, talent, and treasure we proclaim, preserve, and practice our Orthodox Christian faith and make a difference in our parish and community. Stewardship furthers Christ's message within ourselves, our families, and our communities. This creates a spiritual atmosphere of worship, engagement, fulfillment, and inspiration that we can offer to the world, following the example set by God Himself of love, service, and giving.

What does it mean to be a Steward?

Stewardship is a personal responsibility and prayerful commitment that each and every Christian makes in order to support the Church. Stewardship helps us understand that God is the true owner of our possessions, and each of us is accountable to God for the acceptable care and use of those possessions.

According to the Bible, a steward is one who responsibly manages the gifts entrusted to them for the perpetuation of the Lord's work. A steward honors and glorifies God.

ADVENT BOOK STUDY

TREES OF LIFE—A Project of the Interfaith Collaborative to assist the Santa Barbara District Attorney's office in combatting human trafficking

Metaphorically, our community is a tree or even a community of trees: each part of our communal ecosystem impacts all parts. When one part suffers, we all suffer. When one part is lifted up, we are all lifted up.

Coming out of trafficking situations is difficult, often scary, and requires the investment of a whole community to wrap around and support survivors. As a member of the Interfaith Collaborative here in Santa Barbara, our parish will participate in this seasonal project intended to nurture specific local trafficking survivors. All Trees of Life donations go directly to support, sustain, and bless local survivors. These recipients have been identified and specially chosen through the Victim Witness branch of the DA's Office. Adopting one or more Trees of Life connects us to local survivors, and strengthens our communal ecosystem.

We will collect gifts (or monetary donations to purchase gifts) in December. These gifts will bless a specific family or individual during the upcoming holiday season.
