FIRST ANTIPHON—Psalm verses with refrain

- Vs. It is good to give praise unto the Lord, and to chant unto Thy name, O Most High; To proclaim Thy mercy in the morning, and Thy truth by night. [Refrain]
 - Refrain: Through the intercessions of the Theotokos, O Savior, save us.
- Vs. Upright is the Lord our God, and there is no unrighteousness in Him. [Refrain]
- Vs. Glory...now & ever...Amen. [Refrain]

GOSPEL READING—for the Holy Forefathers Luke 14:16-24

The Lord spoke this parable: "A man once gave a great banquet, and invited many; and at the time for the banquet he sent his servant to say to those who had been invited, 'Come; for all is now ready.' But, one by one, they all began to make excuses. The first said to him, 'I have bought a field, and I must go out and see it; I pray you, have me excused.' And another said, 'I have bought five yoke of oxen, and I go to examine them; I pray you, have me excused.' And another said, 'I have married a wife, and therefore I cannot come.' So the servant came and reported this to his master. Then the householder in anger said to his servant, 'Go out quickly to the streets and lanes of the city, and bring in the poor and maimed and blind and lame.' And the servant said, 'Sir, what you commanded has been done, and still there is room.' And the master said to the servant, 'Go out to the highways and hedges, and compel people to come in, that my house may be filled. Meglynarion—Hymn to the Mother of God

Holy Communion

In the Orthodox Church, the Sacrament of Communion is offered only to Orthodox Christians who have humbly prepared to receive through prayer, fasting, and a recent Sacramental Confession.

Non-Orthodox people and those not communing today may approach during Communion for a priestly blessing by saying, "Father, bless." After this you may take a piece of antidoron (blessed bread) offered in the bowls.

If you are interested in joining the One Holy Catholic and Apostolic Church, speak with our Pastor about how to become an Orthodox Christian.

PRAXIS How we practice our Faith — Some Reminders

The laity and clergy live out their roles differently in our worship, while remaining in unity within the overarching prayer of the Divine Service being offered. The laity chiefly pray through the sung, intoned, and read-aloud hymns, readings, and petitions. These are the primary acts of our communally focused worship. It is a beautiful expression of pious devotion when the congregation sings following the choir's lead, as often happens naturally with those well known common and repeated hymns and responses, which go deep into the soul. During the services, the priest has times where he has *mystical* prayers and actions of personal preparation and purification, also prayers of fatherly intercession before the Lord on behalf of the gathered people, the *ecclesia*, some of which are for all to hear but many are *mystical*. Even with these separate roles, all bring their own personal prayer nurtured within in their heart to the act of the communal worship and sacrifice.

At the strong suggestion of our Metropolitan to keep the petitions of the Great Entrance general and short, we will now only say aloud the names of our beloved reposed members whose memorial date is that week and those who have reposed within the last 40 days. It is appropriate for you to pray within yourself or in a whisper for your own dearly loved kinsmen and friends by name during the Great Entrance petitions for the living and departed. The Priests will continue to remember all the names of our reposed Orthodox Christian clergy and members during the *Proskomedi*, at which the prosphora is made ready for the Divine Liturgy. If anyone would like to have a copy of this list, please ask Fr. Symeon.
