THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

GREAT LITANY

FIRST ANTIPHON—Psalm verses with refrain

Vs. It is good to give praise unto the Lord, and to chant unto Thy name, O Most High; To proclaim Thy mercy in the morning, and Thy truth by night. [Refrain]

Refrain: Through the intercessions of the Theotokos, O Savior, save us.

- Vs. Upright is the Lord our God, and there is no unrighteousness in Him. [Refrain]
- Vs. Glory...now & ever...Amen. [Refrain]

SECOND ANTIPHON—Psalm verses with refrain

Vs. The Lord is King, He is clothed with majesty; the Lord is clothed with strength and hath girded Himself.

Refrain: O Son Of God Who rose from the dead, save us who sing to Thee, Alleluia!

- Vs. For He hath established the world which shall not be shaken. [Refrain]
- Vs. Holiness befits Thy house, O Lord, forevermore. [Refrain]

Glory to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit, now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

Only Begotten Son and immortal Word of God who for our salvation didst will to be incarnate of the holy Theotokos and ever virgin Mary, who without change didst become man and wast crucified, O Christ our God, trampling down death by death, who art one of the Holy Trinity, glorified with the Father and the Holy Spirit: save us!

THIRD ANTIPHON—The Beatitudes or "Sermon on the Mount"

HOLY COMMUNION

In the Orthodox Church, the sacrament of Communion is offered only to Christians who are baptized in the name of the Trinity and chrismated into the Orthodox Faith. Non-Orthodox believers **may** approach the chalice for a blessing and the blessed bread instead of the Eucharist. So that the priest is aware of this, please just say,

"Father, bless" when you get to the chalice.

Thanksgiving Prayers after Communion

At the end of the Divine Liturgy, we offer the prayers of thanksgiving for having received the Body and Blood of Christ. These beautiful prayers help us to reflect on the mystery in which we have just partaken, and prepare us for our transition back into the "world." We invite you to listen to these beautiful prayers during and after the veneration of the cross at the end of the service, and ask that you show courtesy to those who are remaining to hear the prayers in their entirety by waiting until Coffee Hour to socialize.

NEED HELP WITH A REWARDING MINISTRY You will be "showered with blessings!"

We need three or four folks from our parish who are retired or free during the day from 10:30 a.m.-1:30 p.m. on Wednesdays to help with the Shower of Blessings Ministry. There is already a team of people in place who run the shower truck. We get anywhere from 15—30 people each week who come and receive the blessing of a free shower. What we offer as a parish is a bit of hospitality and friendship. We serve simple refreshments and visit with our guests. That is where we need some help. The commitment of the team members involves:

Brewing a large pot of coffee and filling a dispenser with water

Making sandwiches (usually peanut butter and jelly)

Setting up a 2 tables

Putting out the refreshments (sometimes also goodies left from coffee hour)

Clean-up



CAMP ST. NICHOLAS - YOUR SUPPORT IS NEEDED



For over 50 years, Camp St. Nicholas in Frazier Park, California has been the summer and winter camp home to generations of campers from the Diocese of Los Angeles and the West, including campers from St. Nicholas Cathedral, Los Angeles; St. Luke, Garden Grove; St. Michael, Van Nuys; St. Anthony, San Diego; St. George, Phoenix; St. Mark, Irvine; St. Simeon, Valencia; St. Athanasius, Santa Barbara; St. Andrew, Riverside; St. George, Phoenix; St. Timothy, Lompoc; St. Barnabus, Costa Mesa; St. Peter, Pomona; St. James, Modesto; and many other parishes.

Although we have been blessed to have had our Camp for so many years, as the facility has aged, repair and maintenance costs have steadily increased. Camp St. Nicholas is a non-profit, and camp attendance fees and other earned revenues come nowhere near covering the expense of maintaining the Camp, so a group of former camp staff and directors have come together to raise awareness and critically needed funds for the immediate repair of the facility, and to build a base of support for the future. Another important goal of this group is to provide an opportunity for fellowship through camp "reunion" events.

With the blessing of His Eminence, Metropolitan Joseph, we are asking that everyone who cares about preserving camp for future generations join the Camp St. Nicholas Legacy Committee and contribute to this effort. The goal for our fundraising campaign is \$30,000, which is based on projects at Camp St. Nicholas that require immediate attention. Making these immediate repairs will allow our children to use the Camp at the upcoming Winter Retreat and Summer Camping programs. Churches, Church groups and individuals are all encouraged to contribute. Your contribution is tax deductible and any amount is greatly appreciated. The projects include:

- Repairing the restrooms in the Mess Hall
- Removing trees which have become dangerous and are a liability
- Applying a protective coating of oil in the Chapel

- Please minimize: movement in general, and entering and leaving during the reading of the Epistle or Gospel, or during the Homily. If you enter while these things are already taking place, please stand in the back and take a seat after the reading or sermon are finished.
- After partaking of Holy Communion, it is important to remain to the end of the Liturgy to thank our Lord and receive the final blessing from the priest.
- Women and young ladies are asked to remove lipstick or lip gloss before kissing icons or receiving the Eucharist.
