THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

GREAT LITANY

First Antiphon—Verses for the Feast of the Presentation of the Theotokos with refrain:

Vs. Great is the Lord and greatly to be praised; in the city of our God and in His holy mountain. Glorious things are spoken of you, o city of God. [Refrain]

Refrain: Through the intercessions of the Theotokos, O Savior, save us.

- Vs. God is known in her palaces for a refuge. As we have heard, so have we seen in the city of the Lord of hosts, in the city of our God. [Refrain]
- Vs. Glory...now & ever...Amen. [Refrain]

Second Antiphon for the Feast of the Presentation of the Theotokos with refrain:

Vs. The Most High hath sanctified His tabernacle. Holiness and majesty are in His sanctuary. [Refrain]

Refrain: O Son Of God Who rose from the dead, save us who sing to Thee, Alleluia!

- Vs. This is the gate of the Lord, by which the righteous shall enter. [Refrain]
- Vs. Holy is Thy temple, and wonderful in righteous [Refrain]

Glory to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit, now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

Only Begotten Son and immortal Word of God who for our salvation didst will to be incarnate of the holy Theotokos and ever-virgin Mary, who without change didst become man and wast crucified, O Christ our God, trampling down death by death, who art one of the Holy Trinity, glorified with the Father and the Holy Spirit: save us!

Third Antiphon for the Feast of the Presentation of the Theotokos with refrain:

Vs. 1 Even the rich among the people shall entreat thy favor.

Refrain:

Today is the prelude of the good will of God, of the preaching of the salvation of mankind. The Virgin appears in the Temple of God, in anticipation proclaiming Christ to all. Let us rejoice and sing to her://
"Rejoice, O Fulfillment of the Creator's dispensation!"

- Vs. 2 The King's daughter is all glorious within: her clothing is of wrought gold. [Refrain]
- Vs. 3 Virgins shall be brought to the King after her: her companions shall be brought unto Thee. [Refrain]

Thou didst shatter death by Thy Cross; Thou didst open paradise to the thief; Thou didst turn the sadness of the ointment bearing women into joy, and didst bid Thine apostles proclaim a warning that Thou hast risen, O Christ, granting the world the great mercy.

Troparion of Presentation of the Theotokos in the Temple

Tone 4 (Slavic Chant)

Today is the prelude of the good will of God, of the preaching of the salvation of mankind. The Virgin appears in the Temple of God, in anticipation proclaiming Christ to all. Let us rejoice and sing to her:// "Rejoice, O Fulfillment of the Creator's dispensation!"

Troparion to St. Athanasius (Music on p. 54 of Liturgy book)

Tone 3 (Byzantine melody harmonized by Fr. J. Finley)

Holy Bishop Athanasius,

you became a stronghold of Orthodoxy,

strengthening the Church through your divine teachings.

Opposing the heretical opinion of Arius,

you explained and taught that the Son is equal in nature with the Father.

O holy Father, intercede with Christ God

that He may grant us abundant mercy.

Kontakion for the Presentation of the Theotokos

Tone 4 (Slavic Chant)

The most pure Temple of the <u>Sav</u>ior; the precious Chamber and <u>Virgin</u>; the sacred Treasure of the <u>glory</u> of God, is presented today to the <u>house</u> of the Lord. She brings with her the grace of the <u>Spirit</u>, therefore, the Angels of God <u>praise</u> her: "Truly this woman is the abode of <u>Heav</u>en!"

TRISAGION (THRICE-HOLY) HYMN (Music composed for our parish by Nazo Zakkak)

Holy God, Holy Mighty, Holy Immortal, have mercy on us. (sung 3 times)

+Glory to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit, now and ever and unto ages of ages. Amen. Holy Immortal have mercy on us.

People: Holy God, Holy Mighty, Holy Immortal, have mercy on us.

Preparatory Psalm Verses before the Epistle (Page 61 of Liturgy Book)

Tone 7 (Byzantine melody harmonized by Fr. J. Finley)

The Lord will give strength to His people; the Lord will bless His people with peace.

Vs: Ascribe to the Lord, O sons of God, ascribe to the Lord honor and glory.

EPISTLE READING—Ephesians 2:14-22

Brethren, Christ is our peace, who has made us both one, and has broken down the dividing wall of hostility, by abolishing in his flesh the law of commandments and ordinances, that he might create in Himself one new man in place of the two, so making peace, and might reconcile us both to God in one body through the Cross, thereby bringing the hostility to an end. And He came and preached peace to you, who were far off, and peace to those who were near; for through Him we both have access in one Spirit to the Father. So then you are no longer strangers and sojourners, but you are fellow citizens with the saints and members of the household of God, built upon the foundation of the apostles and prophets, Christ Jesus himself being the cornerstone, in whom the whole structure is joined together and grows into a holy temple in the Lord; in whom you also are built into it for a dwelling place of God in the Spirit.

GOSPEL READING—Luke 12:16-21

The Lord spoke this parable, "The land of a rich man brought forth plentifully; and he thought to himself, `What shall I do, for I have nowhere to store my crops?' And he said, `I will do this: I will pull down my barns, and build larger ones; and there I will store all my grain and my goods. And I will say to my soul, Soul, you have ample goods laid up for many years; take your ease, eat, drink, be merry.' But God said to him, `Fool! This night your soul is required of you; and the things you have prepared, whose will they be?' So is he who lays up treasure for himself, and is not rich toward God."

As He said this, Jesus called out, "He who has ears to hear, let him hear".

LITURGY OF THE FAITHFUL

Meglynarion—Hymn to the Mother of God for the Feast of the Presentation of the Theotokos

The Angels beheld the Entrance of the Pure One and were amazed.

How has the Virgin entered into the Holy of Holies?

Since she is a living Ark of God

let no profane hand touch the Theotokos.

But let the lips of believers unceasingly sing to her,

praising her in joy with the Angel's song:

"Truly, you are more exalted than all, O pure Virgin!"

Hymns sung as the clergy receive the Eucharist for the feast of the Cross

- Praise the Lord from the heavens, praise Him in the highest! (Ps 148:1)
- I will receive the cup of salvation and call on the name of the Lord! Alleluia! (Psalm 116:13)
- The Jesus Prayer: "O Lord Jesus Christ, Son of God, have mercy on me, a sinner."

CHURCH ETIQUETTE CORNER Remain to Give Thanks

As we would remain after a meal to give thanks to our host, it is customary to remain after Communion to give thanks to our Lord for blessing us with the "medicine of immortality" and to receive the final blessing of Christ from the priest. There may be exceptions with children and those setting up coffee hour, but let us make every effort to conclude our worship with thanksgiving.
