

THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

THE GREAT LITANY

First Antiphon—Psalm Verses for the Feast with Refrain

Verse: When Israel went forth from Egypt, the house of Jacob from a people of strange

language, Judah became his sanctuary, Israel his dominion.

Refrain: Through the intercessions of the Theotokos,

O Savior, save us.

Verse: The sea looked and fled, Jordan turned back. What ails you, o sea,

that you flee? O Jordan, that you turn back? [refrain]

Verse: Glory....now and ever... [refrain]

Second Antiphon-Psalm Verses for the Feast with Refrain

Verse: I love the Lord because He has heard the voice of my supplication.

Because He inclined His ear to me, therefore I will call on Him as long as I live.

Refrain: O Son of God baptized in the Jordan, save us who sing to Thee,

Alleluia!

Verse: The snares of death encompassed me; the pangs of hell laid hold on me. I suf-

fered distress and anguish, then I called on the name of the Lord. [refrain]

EPISTLE READING Ephesians 4:7-13

Brethren, grace was given to each of us according to the measure of Christ's gift. Therefore it is said, "When He ascended on high He led a host of captives, and He gave gifts to men." (In saying, "He ascended," what does it mean but that He had also descended into the lower parts of the earth? He who descended is He who also ascended far above all the heavens, that He might fill all things.) And His gifts were that some should be apostles, some prophets, some evangelists, some pastors and teachers, to equip the saints for the work of ministry, for building up the body of Christ, until we all attain to the unity of the faith and of the knowledge of the Son of God, to mature manhood, to the measure of the stature of the fullness of Christ.

GOSPEL READING Matthew 4:12-17

At that time, when Jesus heard that John had been arrested, he withdrew into Galilee; and leaving Nazareth he went and dwelt in Capernaum by the sea, in the territory of Zebulon and Naphtali, so that what was spoken by the prophet Isaiah might be fulfilled: "The land of Zebulon and the land of Naphtali, toward the sea, across the Jordan, Galilee of the Gentiles—the people who sat in darkness have seen a great light, and for those who sat in the region and shadow of death light has dawned." From that time Jesus began to preach, saying, "Repent, for the kingdom of Heaven is at hand."

LITURGY OF THE FAITHFUL

Meglynarion for the Feast of Epiphany (Hymn to the Mother of God)

Magnify, O my soul, the most-pure Virgin Theotokos, more honorable than the heavenly hosts!

No tongue knows how to praise you worthily, O Theotokos;

even Angels are overcome with awe praising you.

But since you are good, accept our faith;

for you know our love inspired by God!

You are the defender of Christians, and we magnify you.

Communion of the Clergy (Liturgy Book page 32)

Praise the Lord from the heavens! Praise Him in the highest! (*Ps 148:1*) The grace of God has appeared for the salvation of all. Alleluia. (Titus 2:11)

HOLY COMMUNION

In the Orthodox Church, the sacrament of Communion is offered only to Christians who are baptized in the name of the Trinity and chrismated into the Orthodox Faith. Non-Orthodox believers **may approach the chalice for a blessing and the blessed bread instead of the Eucharist.** So that the priest is aware of this, please just say,

"Father, bless" when you get to the chalice.

Thanksgiving Prayers after Communion

At the end of the Divine Liturgy, we offer the prayers of thanksgiving for having received the Body and Blood of Christ. These beautiful prayers help us to reflect on the mystery in which we have just partaken, and prepare us for our transition back into the "world." We invite you to listen to these beautiful prayers during and after the veneration of the cross at the end of the service, and ask that you show courtesy to those who are remaining to hear the prayers in their entirety by waiting until Coffee Hour to socialize.

Fr. Joseph Misoi

Fr. Joseph Misoi was born in 1965 in the Mugen location of Western Kenya in Nandiland. Immediately, after finishing school, he applied to the Makario's III Patriarchal Seminary in Nairobi with the desire to serve the Orthodox Church in his home area. Graduating in 1991 at 25 years old, he served as a catechist for some years. In 1999 he was ordained to the diaconate and then to the priesthood. Fr. Joseph currently serves as a traveling missionary priest.

Orthodoxy came to the people of East Africa, not through the efforts of a single missionary, but through charismatic African men searching for truth and "ortho doxia" in the

early 1920's. Correspondence began with the Patriarch of Alexandria, and in 1946, they were received into canonical Orthodoxy through Patriarch Christophoros. In 1958, the Patriarch appointed Nicholas (Valeropoulos) the first Metropolitan of Irinoupolis and All East Africa, and in 1972, three African priests were ordained to the rank of auxiliary bishop.

The Support a Mission Priest
(SAMP) Program of the
Orthodox Christian Mission
Center (OCMC) offers monthly financial assistance to
indigenous priests in the
world's poorest areas. These
funds make it possible for
priests to minister and serve
their growing communities.

In 1972 construction began on the Makarios III Patriarchal Seminary in Nairobi, Kenya. Archbishop Anastasios (Yannoulatos),

who in 1982 was assigned as Acting Archbishop, completed the seminary and undertook the training of indigenous priests, translations, and the building of churches, clinics, and schools.



In November 2015, the Holy and Sacred Synod of the Patriarchate of Alexandria expanded the Church in Kenya into three dioceses: the Metropolis of Nairobi, under His Eminence Archbishop Makarios (above, left); the Diocese of Nyeri and Mount Kenya, under His Grace Bishop Neofitos (above, right); and the Diocese

of Kisumu and West Kenya, under His Grace Bishop Athanasios (above, center).
