When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place. And suddenly a sound came from heaven like the rush of a mighty wind, and it filled all the house where they were sitting. And there appeared to them tongues as of fire, distributed and resting on each one of them. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues, as the Spirit gave them utterance.

Now there were dwelling in Jerusalem Jews, devout men from every nation under heaven. And at this sound the multitude came together, and they were bewildered, because each one heard them speaking in his own language. And they were amazed and wondered, saying, "Are not all these who are speaking Galileans? And how is it that we hear, each of us in his own native language? Parthians and Medes and Elamites and residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya belonging to Cyrene, and visitors from Rome, both Jews and proselytes, Cretans and Arabians, we hear them telling in our own tongues the mighty works of God."

THE GOSPEL READING for PENTECOST John 7:37-52, 8:12

On the last day of the feast, the great day, Jesus stood up and proclaimed, "If anyone thirst, let him come to Me and drink. He who believes in Me, as the Scripture has said, 'Out of his belly shall flow rivers of living water." Now this He said about the Spirit, which those who believed in Him were to receive; for as yet the Spirit had not been given, because Jesus was not yet glorified.

When they heard these words, many of the people said, "This is really the prophet." Others said, "This is the Christ." But some said, "Is the Christ to come from Galilee? Has not the Scripture said that the Christ is descended from David, and comes from Bethlehem, the village where David was?" So there was a division among the people over Him. Some of them wanted to arrest Him, but no one laid hands on Him.

The officers then went back to the chief priests and Pharisees, who said to them, "Why did you not bring Him?" The officers answered, "No man ever spoke like this man!" The Pharisees answered them, "Are you led astray, you also? Have any of the authorities or of the Pharisees believed in Him? But this crowd, who do not know the Law, are accursed." Nicodemus, who had gone to Him before, and who was one of them, said to them, "Does our Law judge a man without first giving him a hearing and learning what he does?" They replied, "Are you from Galilee too? Search and you will see that no prophet is to rise from Galilee."

Again Jesus spoke to them, saying, "I am the light of the world; he who follows Me will not walk in darkness, but will have the light of life."

HYMN TO THE MOTHER OF GOD (Meglynarion)

9th Ode of the Canon for Pentecost:

Rejoice, O Queen, glory of mothers and virgins! No tongue, however sweet or fluent, is eloquent enough to praise you worthily. Every mind is overawed by your childbearing. Therefore, with one voice, we glorify you.

Hymns for Communion of the Clergy:

Let Your good Spirit lead me on a level path. Alleluia, Alleluia, Alleluia. (Ps. 143)

Instead of "We have seen the true light, we sing the <u>Troparion for Pentecost.</u> (Music on previous page.)

At the end of the Liturgy, we will say the **Kneeling Prayers of Pentecost**. Between Pascha and Pentecost, the Church proscribes no kneeling during services as we celebrate the joy of the Resurrection for 40 days. With these prayers, we resume kneeling in the church.

HOLY COMMUNION

In the Orthodox Church, the sacrament of Communion is offered only to Christians who are baptized in the name of the Trinity and chrismated into the Orthodox Faith. Non-Orthodox believers may approach the chalice for a blessing and the blessed bread instead of the Eucharist. So that the priest is aware of this, please just say,

"Father, bless" when you get to the chalice.

Thanksgiving Prayers after Communion

At the end of the Divine Liturgy, we offer the prayers of thanksgiving for having received the Body and Blood of Christ. These beautiful prayers help us to reflect on the mystery in which we have just partaken, and prepare us for our transition back into the "world." We invite you to listen to these beautiful prayers during and after the veneration of the cross at the end of the service, and ask that you show courtesy to those who are remaining to hear the prayers in their entirety by waiting until Coffee Hour to socialize.



These gifts are for us!

- **Wisdom:** knowing the way that pleases God and walking in it
- Understanding: seeing clearly with spiritual eyes as a result of listening for God's voice with an open heart
- Counsel: helpful words and wise guidance for others
- Might: strength and courage to do what's right
- Knowledge: knowing more and more of God through prayer, God's Word and God's Creation
- Fear of the Lord: living without fear of anyone or anything except the Awesome, Holy, and Almighty God in whom we take refuge
- **Delight:** living in joy and wonder at the recognition of God's presence all around, all the time

TATIANA SPEIER HEADED TO ALBANIA WITH O.C.M.C.

Tatiana (Tati) Speier will represent the youth of our parish in an OCMC (Orthodox Christian Mission Center) missions trip to Durres, Albania from June 13-27! While in Albania, she will be staying at the Home of Hope—an orphanage at the Shlen Vast Monastery. The missions team will create a summer camp for the children at Home of Hope, their only vacation from school each year. The children there range from ages 5-13 and the team will create lessons and activities in arts and crafts, games, sports, music, English and Bible studies for them to enjoy. Tati has been assigned to aid in arts and crafts and sports, and she is very excited about that!



62% of the Albanian population is Muslim while 30% are Christian (17% of them being Orthodox). It is so important to nurture these children with Christ's love and teachings amidst a mainly Muslim country.

Tati has raised over \$2,000 of the \$3,290 needed for the mission trip. Our parish is committed to assisting with the remaining balance of \$1,100, which will help cover her plane fare. If you would like to support this exciting effort, please make your donation by June 11th either through the tithe box, in the mail, or on the parish website. Be sure to include a note that says, "Tati's OCMC trip."
