THE DIVINE LITURGY OF ST. JOHN CHRYSOSTOM

GREAT LITANY

FIRST ANTIPHON—Psalm verses for the Feast of Transfiguration with Refrain

Vs. Great is the Lord, and greatly to be praised, in the city of our God, in His holy mountain. Who settest fast the mountains by Thy strength, Who art girded about with power.

Refrain: Through the intercessions of the Theotokos, O Savior, save us.

- Vs. Who coverest Thyself with light as with a garment. The mountains shall rejoice at the presence of the Lord, for He cometh; yea, He is come to judge the earth. (*Refrain*)
- Vs. Glory...now & ever...Amen. (Refrain)

SECOND ANTIPHON—Psalm verses for the Feast of Transfiguration with Refrain

Vs. His foundations are in the holy mountains. The Lord loveth the gates of Zion more than all the dwellings of Jacob.

Refrain: O Son of God, transfigured on Mount Tabor, save us who sing to Thee, Alleluia!

- Vs. Glorious things are spoken of thee, O city of God. (*Refrain*)
- Vs. Zion is our mother, a man shall say, and such a man was born in her; and the Most High Himself hath established her. (*Refrain*)

Glory to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit, now and ever and unto ages of ages. Amen.

Only begotten Son and immortal Word of God, who for our salvation didst will to be incarnate of the Holy Theotokos and ever-virgin Mary, who without change didst become man and was crucified, O Christ our God, trampling down death by death, who art one of the Holy Trinity, glorified with the Father and the Holy Spirit: save us.

AS THE CLERGY GO IN PROCESSION TO THE BAPTISMAL FONT, WE SING THE THIRD ANTIPHON FOR THE FEAST OF TRANSFIGURATION AND THE HYMNS OF THE DAY:

THIRD ANTIPHON—Verses with Troparion Refrain for the Feast

Vs. Of Thy mercies, O Lord, will I sing forever. (Ps. 88:2)

Refrain: (See next page for music.)

You were transfigured on the mountain, O Christ God, revealing Your glory to Your disciples, as far as they could bear it. Let your everlasting light shine upon us sinners, through the prayers of the Theotokos. Glory to You, O Giver of light!

- Vs. The heavens shall confess Thy wonders, O Lord, and Thy truth in the congregation of saints. (Refrain)
- Vs. Blessed is the people that knoweth jubilation. O Lord, in the light of Thy countenance shall they walk, and in Thy Name shall they rejoice all the day long. (Refrain)

Troparion of the Resurrection (Music on p. 40 of Liturgy book)

Glory to You, O Giver of light!

While the stone was sealed by the Jews, and the soldiers were guarding Thy most pure body, Thou didst arise on the third day, O Savior, granting life to the world. For which cause the heavenly pow'rs cried aloud unto Thee, O Giver of life; Glory to Thy resurrection, O Christ! Glory to Thy kingdom! Glory to Thy providence, O Thou Who alone art the lover of mankind.

you explained and taught that the Son is equal in nature with the Father.

that He may grant us abundant mercy.

Kontakion for the Feast of the Transfiguration of Our Lord Tone 7 Carpathian Chant You were transfigured on the mountain, O Christ God, and Your disciples saw Your glory as far as they were able, so that when they saw You crucified, they might know that You suffered voluntarily, and might proclaim to the world that You are truly the radiance of the Father.



BAPTISM of Wesley Speier & Amelia Macdonald

After the Baptisms and Chrismations, the clergy circle the baptismal font three times with the children and godparents, and then the clergy process into to the altar for the readings.

As many as have been baptized into Christ have put on Christ Alleluia, Alleluia, Alleluia. (Repeat 3X)

BAPTISMAL EPISTLE READING

EPISTLE READING for the DAY 1 Corinthians. (4:9-16)

Brethren, God has exhibited us Apostles as last of all, like men sentenced to death; because we have become a spectacle to the world, to angels and to men. We are fools for Christ's sake, but you are wise in Christ. We are weak, but you are strong. You are held in honor, but we in disrepute. To the present hour we hunger and thirst, we are ill clad and buffeted and homeless; and we labor, working with our own hands. When reviled, we bless; when persecuted, we endure; when slandered, we try to conciliate; we have become, and are now, as the refuse of the world, the off scouring of all things. I do not write this to make you ashamed, but to admonish you as my beloved children. For though you have countless guides in Christ, you do not have many fathers. For I became your father in Christ Jesus through the Gospel. I urge you, then, be imitators of me.

BAPTISMAL GOSPEL READING

GOSPEL READING for the DAY Matthew. (17:14-23)

At that time, a man came up to Jesus and kneeling before Him said, "Lord, have mercy on my son, for he is an epileptic and he suffers terribly; for often he falls into the fire, and often into the water. And I brought him to Thy disciples, and they could not heal him." And Jesus answered, "O faithless and perverse generation, how long am I to be with you? How long am I to bear with you? Bring him here to me." And Jesus rebuked him, and the demon came out of him, and the boy was cured instantly. Then the disciples came to Jesus privately and said, "Why could we not cast it out?" Jesus said to them, "Because you have no faith. For truly, I say to you, if you have faith as a grain of mustard seed, you will say to this mountain, 'Move from here to there,' and it will move; and nothing will be impossible to you. This kind never comes out except by prayer and fasting." As they were traveling together through Galilee, Jesus said to them, "The Son of man is to be delivered into the hands of men, and they will kill Him, and He will rise on the third day."

Meglynarion—Hymn to the Mother of God

Magnify, O my soul, the Lord who was transfigured on Mount Tabor! Your birthgiving was incorruptible! God came from your body, and appeared on earth in the flesh, dwelling among mankind. Therefore we magnify you, O Theotokos!

Communion Hymns

Praise the Lord from the heavens, praise Him in the highest! (Ps 148:1)

O Lord, we shall walk in the light of Your face, and rejoice in Your name all the day. (Ps 88/89:15b)

Instead of "We have seen the True Light," we sing the Troparion of the feast.

HOLY COMMUNION

In the Orthodox Church, the sacrament of Communion is offered only to Christians who are baptized in the name of the Trinity and chrismated into the Orthodox Faith. Non-Orthodox believers **may approach the chalice for a blessing and the blessed bread instead of the Eucharist.** So that the priest is aware of this, please just say,

"Father, bless" when you get to the chalice.

Thanksgiving Prayers after Communion

At the end of the Divine Liturgy, we offer the prayers of thanksgiving for having received the Body and Blood of Christ. These beautiful prayers help us to reflect on the mystery in which we have just partaken, and prepare us for our transition back into the "world." We invite you to listen to these beautiful prayers during and after the veneration of the cross at the end of the service, and ask that you show courtesy to those who are remaining to hear the prayers in their entirety by waiting until Coffee Hour to socialize.

Coffee Hour Tips from Christie

- A weekly reminder email is sent out to the host, advisor and helpers.
 Check in with your advisor and helpers to make sure everyone knows their duties and can check in with you to make sure they are not needed before they go home.
- After everyone has gone through the line, condense the food to less serving trays and tables so you can begin clean up early.
- Team up with another family or a group to host.
- Ask a friend to help you with the clean up on your hosting day and you return the favor on theirs.
- Use disposable serving dishes. They are all recyclable and decrease your clean up time tremendously.
- Do what is easy for you!!

We ask that each parish family/household host or co-host a Coffee Hour once during the year. This is our chance to offer hospitality and to provide the opportunity for fellowship for the whole parish after the Sunday Divine Liturgy. Coffee Hour is an important time for bonding and reaching out to each other. It's also a great way to commemorate a birthday, anniversary, or name day, or to honor the memory of a departed family member. Singles are encouraged to host with a friend or two, or we can partner you with someone who would like to co-host.
