THE DIVINE LITURGY OF ST. JOHN CHRYSOSTOM

THE GREAT LITANY

First Antiphon—Psalm Verses for the Feast of Theophany with Refrain

Verse: When Israel went forth from Egypt, the house of Jacob from a people of strange

language, Judah became his sanctuary, Israel his dominion.

Refrain: Through the intercessions of the Theotokos,

O Savior, save us.

Verse: The sea looked and fled, Jordan turned back. What ails you, o sea,

that you flee? O Jordan, that you turn back? [refrain]

Verse: Glory....now and ever... [refrain]

Second Antiphon-Psalm Verses for the Feast of Theophany with Refrain

Verse: I love the Lord because He has heard the voice of my supplication.

Because He inclined His ear to me, therefore I will call on Him as long as I live.

Refrain: O Son of God baptized in the Jordan, save us who sing to Thee,

Alleluia!

Verse: The snares of death encompassed me; the pangs of hell laid hold on me. I suf-

fered distress and anguish, then I called on the name of the Lord. [refrain]

Verse: Gracious and righteous is the Lord, and our God is merciful. [refrain]

Glory to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit,

now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

Only Begotten Son and immortal Word of God who for our salvation didst will to be incarnate of the holy Theotokos and ever virgin Mary, who without change didst become man and wast crucified, O Christ our God, trampling down death by death, who art one of the Holy Trinity, glorified with the Father and the Holy Spirit: save us!

Thou didst shatter death by Thy Cross; Thou didst open paradise to the thief; Thou didst turn the sadness of the ointment bearing women into joy, and didst bid Thine apostles proclaim a warning that Thou hast risen, O Christ, granting the world the great mercy.

THE EPISTLE READING Ephesians 4:7-13

Brethren, grace was given to each of us according to the measure of Christ's gift. Therefore, it is said, "When He ascended on high He led a host of captives, and He gave gifts to men." (In saying, "He ascended," what does it mean but that He had also descended into the lower parts of the earth? He who descended is He who also ascended far above all the heavens, that He might fill all things.) And His gifts were that some should be apostles, some prophets, some evangelists, some pastors and teachers, to equip the saints for the work of ministry, for building up the body of Christ, until we all attain to the unity of the faith and of the knowledge of the Son of God, to mature manhood, to the measure of the stature of the fullness of Christ.

THE GOSPEL READING Matthew. 4:12-17

At that time, when Jesus heard that John had been arrested, he withdrew into Galilee; and leaving Nazareth he went and dwelt in Capernaum by the sea, in the territory of Zebulon and Naphtali, so that what was spoken by the prophet Isaiah might be fulfilled: "The land of Zebulon and the land of Naphtali, toward the sea, across the Jordan, Galilee of the Gentiles—the people who sat in darkness have seen a great light, and for those who sat in the region and shadow of death light has dawned." From that time Jesus began to preach, saying, "Repent, for the kingdom of Heaven is at hand."

In the Orthodox Church, the sacrament of Communion is offered only to Christians who are baptized in the name of the Trinity and chrismated into the Orthodox Faith. Non-Orthodox believers may approach the chalice for a blessing and the blessed bread instead of the Eucharist. So that the priest is aware of this, please just say,

"Father, bless" when you get to the chalice.

At the end of the Divine Liturgy, we offer the prayers of thanksgiving for having received the Body and Blood of Christ. These beautiful prayers help us to reflect on the mystery in which we have just partaken, and prepare us for our transition back into the "world." We invite you to listen to these beautiful prayers during and after the veneration of the cross at the end of the service, and ask that you show courtesy to those who are remaining to hear the prayers in their entirety by waiting until Coffee Hour to socialize.

California & THE WEST Sanctifying the sea

With the holidays ended and the early January Iull in gear, the tourist population by the waterfront was down somewhat this weekend. Even so, a healthy gathering of visitors to the ever-popular breakwater found themselves in the midst of an uncommon, sanctified event early on Sunday of the programment.

day afternoon.

A small choir lined up along the part of the concrete wall facing the Yacht Club. On the stretch of beach before the choir, a temporary altar was set up, attended by three Greek Orthodox priests and deacons, in full vestments and regalia but bare of feet, reading from a special ceremony, interspersed with the choir's chanting. At a specific moment in the proceedings, they also offered blessings for young divers symbolically — and actually — retrieving crosses from the sea.

It was all part of the "Blessings of the Waters & Santa Barbara Fisherman," a collaborative effort of the Santa Barbara-based Saint Barbara Greek Orthodox Church and the newer St. Athanasius Antiochian Orthodox Church in Goleta. Although this is the third annual Epiphany Celebration in Santa Barbara, the tradition is blessed with antiquity, on the Orthodox Sunday known as Theophany, after a "Great Sanctification of Water" in the church.

In its deeper, venerable tradition, the blessing ceremony also commemorates the baptism of Jesus by John the Baptist, in the water of the Jordan River.

Father Bob Fox, pastor of the Saint Barbara Greek Orthodox church, commented before the service that "this year, we have an especially large amount to be grateful for. The majority of this city was

preserved. I see a couple of you here now who were evacuated from their homes and were worried about the dangers of a fire overtaking their homes. But yet, they are here today and very thankful that God had preserved them."

"There were a number of people who did lose everything, and we're very thankful that there are a lot of people who, in Christian love, are reaching out to them and helping them to rebuild. It's time like this where we are challenged to go to where the root of our faith is."

Fr. Nicholas Speier, pastor of the Goleta congregation, read "Today the nature of the waters is sanctified, and the Jordan is parted in two; it holds back the stream of its own waters, seeing the Master wash himself." Later in the sacred text, the priest listed a series of specific prayers and spiritual entreaties, such as "for travelers by sea, by land and by air, the sick, the suffering, captives and their salvation, let us pray to the Lord. That this water may be sanctified by the power and operation and descent of the Holy Spirit."


ing year."
