

January 7, 2024 Synaxis of the Holy Prophet, Forerunner & Baptist John

We are glad you are with us this morning to join our worship of the Father, Son & Holy Spirit! Please join us on the patio after the Liturgy for the Agape Meal. We'd love to meet you!

We welcome children of all ages in our worship.

HOLY COMMUNION

In the Orthodox Church, the sacrament of Communion is offered only to Orthodox Christians who have prepared to receive through prayer and recent Confession.

Non-Orthodox believers and others may approach the chalice for a blessing and the blessed bread.

So that the priest is aware of this, please just say,

"Father, bless" when you get to the chalice.

At the conclusion of Matins, we sing the Great Doxology followed by the Matins Dismissal Troparion

THE DIVINE LITURGY OF ST. JOHN CHRYSOSTOM

First Antiphon—Psalm Verses for the Feast of Theophany with Refrain

Verse: When Israel went forth from Egypt, the house of Jacob from a people of strange language, Judah became his sanctuary, Israel his dominion.

Refrain: Through the intercessions of the Theotokos, O Savior, save us.

Verse: The sea looked and fled, Jordan turned back. What ails you, o sea,

that you flee? O Jordan, that you turn back? [refrain]

Verse: Glory....now and ever... [refrain]

Second Antiphon-Psalm Verses for the Feast of Theophany with Refrain

Verse: I love the Lord because He has heard the voice of my supplication.

Because He inclined His ear to me, therefore I will call on Him as long as I live.

Refrain: O Son of God baptized in the Jordan, save us who sing to Thee,

Alleluia!

Verse: The snares of death encompassed me; the pangs of hell laid hold on me. I suffered distress and anguish, then I called on the name of the Lord. [refrain]

Verse: Gracious and righteous is the Lord, and our God is merciful. [refrain]

Glory to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit, now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

Only Begotten Son and immortal Word of God who for our salvation didst will to be incarnate of the holy Theotokos and ever virgin Mary, who without change didst become man and wast crucified, O Christ our God, trampling down death by death, who art one of the Holy Trinity, glorified with the Father and the Holy Spirit: save us!

Tone 6

When Mary stood at Thy grave looking for Thy sacred body, angelic pow'rs shone above Thy revered tomb, and the soldiers who were to keep guard became as dead men. Thou led Hades captive and wast not tempted there-by, Thou did meet the Virgin and didst give life to the world. O Thou Who art risen from the dead, O Lord, glory to Thee.

Troparion of Theophany

Tone 1

When You, O Lord, were baptized in the Jordan, worship of the Trinity was made manifest! For the voice of the Father bore witness to You, calling You his beloved Son.
And the Spirit, in the likeness of a dove confirmed the truth of His Word.
Christ our God, Who has appeared and enlighted the world, Glory to You!

Troparion for the Synaxis of John the Baptist

Tone 2

The <u>mem</u>ory of the righteous is celebrated with <u>hymns</u> of praise, but the Lord's testimony is sufficient for you, O <u>Fore</u>runner. You were <u>shown</u> in truth to be the most honorable of the <u>Proph</u>ets, for you were deemed worthy to baptize in the streams of the Jordan Him Whom they foretold.

Therefore, having suffered for the <u>truth</u> with joy, you proclaimed to those in hell God Who appeared in the flesh, Who <u>takes</u> away the <u>sin</u> of the world// and grants us <u>great mercy</u>.

Troparion to St. Athanasius

Tone 3

Holy Bishop Athanasius, you became a stronghold of Orthodoxy, strengthening the Church through your divine teachings. Opposing the heretical opinion of Arius, you explained and taught that the Son is equal in nature with the Father. O holy Father, intercede with Christ God that He may grant us abundant mercy.

Kontakian of Theophany

Tone 4

Today You have shone forth to the <u>world</u>, O Lord, and the light of Your countenance has been <u>marked</u> on us. Knowing You, we sing Your <u>praises</u>: "You have come and re<u>vealed</u> Yourself,// O unapproachable Light."

THE ANTI-TRISAGION HYMN (Sung in place of "Holy God")

As many as have been baptized into Christ have put on Christ. Alleluia. (THRICE)

Preparatory Psalm Verses before the Epistle (Prokeimenon)

Tone 7

The righteous shall rejoice in the Lord / and shall hope in Him. (Ps. 63:11a)

Vs. Hear my voice, O God.

EPISTLE READING Acts of the Apostles 19:1-8

In those days, while Apollos was at Corinth, Paul passed through the upper country and came to Ephesus. There he found some disciples. And he said to them, "Did you receive the Holy Spirit when you believed?" And they said, "No, we have never even heard that there is a Holy Spirit." And he said, "Into what then were you baptized?" They said, "Into John's baptism." And Paul said, "John baptized with the baptism of repentance, telling the people to believe in the One Who was to come after him, that is, Jesus." On hearing this, they were baptized in the Name of the Lord Jesus. And when Paul had laid his hands upon them, the Holy Spirit came on them; and they spoke with tongues and prophesied. There were about twelve of them in all. And he entered the synagogue and for three months spoke boldly, arguing and pleading about the Kingdom of God.

GOSPEL READING John 1:29-34

At that time, John saw Jesus coming toward him, and said, "Behold, the Lamb of God, Who takes away the sin of the world! This is He of Whom I said, 'After me comes a man Who ranks before me, for He was before me.' I myself did not know Him; but for this I came baptizing with water, that He might be revealed to Israel." And John bore witness, "I saw the Spirit descend as a dove from heaven, and it remained on Him. I myself did not know Him; but He Who sent me to baptize with water said to me, 'He on Whom you see the Spirit descend and remain, this is He Who baptizes with the Holy Spirit.' And I have seen and have borne witness that this is the Son of God."

Meglynarion for the Feast of Epiphany (Hymn to the Mother of God)

Magnify, O my soul, the most-pure Virgin Theotokos, more honorable than the heavenly hosts!

No tongue knows how to praise you worthily, O Theotokos; even Angels are overcome with awe praising you. But since you are good, accept our faith; for you know our love inspired by God! You are the defender of Christians, and we magnify you.

COMMUNION HYMNS

Praise the Lord from the heavens, praise Him in the highest! (Ps. 148:1) The righteous shall be in everlasting remembrance! He shall not fear evil tidings! (Ps. 111:6) The grace of God has appeared for the salvation of all. (Ps. 118/119)

After Communion, instead of singing "We have seen the true light", we sing the Troparion of the Theophany.

Thanksgiving Prayers after Communion

(Blessing of the Agape Meal will follow the prayers.)

At the end of the Divine Liturgy, we offer the prayers of thanksgiving for having received the Body and Blood of Christ. These beautiful prayers help us to reflect on the mystery in which we have just partaken, and prepare us for our transition back into the "world." We invite you to listen to these beautiful prayers during and after the veneration of the cross at the end of the service, and <u>ask that all of your socializing take</u> place outside of the church.

THE CHILDREN'S RELIEF FUND (CRF)

The Children's Relief Fund (CRF) is a program within our Antiocian Archdiocese which was founded in 1983, and provides funds for the children in need in Lebanon and Palestine, and the children of Syrian refugees in Lebanon.

The CRF, under the Department of Charitable Outreach, has been a blessing to hundreds of needy children and their families.

Since 1983, the CRF has provided close to \$4 million in aid. 100% of donations go directly to the sponsored child and no money is used for administrative services.

SPONSORSHIP

Through the CRF, sponsoring a child is easy. Child sponsorship is an opportunity to personally connect with a child and work alongside their family and community as they work on lasting solutions to the causes that keep vulnerable children from reaching their God given potential.

You can help change the life of a child by being a sponsor for as little as \$400 a year, just \$7.69 per week, \$1.10 per day. Donations in any amount are always welcome. Once you sponsor a child, CRF will send you the child's name, age, address and a brief biography. Your child will correspond with you, sending you letters and pictures about their life. You will be able to develop a special bond and personal relationship with them.

Your assistance will improve the lives of these children and give them a chance for a better future.
