

THE DIVINE LITURGY OF ST. JOHN CHRYSOSTOM

THE GREAT LITANY

FIRST ANTIPHON—Psalm verses with refrain

Vs. It is good to give praise unto the Lord, and to chant unto Thy name, O Most High;

To proclaim Thy mercy in the morning, and Thy truth by night. [Refrain]

Refrain: Through the intercessions of the Theotokos, O Savior, save us.

- Vs. Upright is the Lord our God, and there is no unrighteousness in Him. [Refrain]
- Vs. Glory...now & ever...Amen. [Refrain]

SECOND ANTIPHON—Psalm verses with refrain

EPISTLE READING for the Sunday of Forgiveness Romans 13:11-14:4

Brethren, salvation is nearer to us now than when we first believed; the night is far gone, the day is at hand. Let us then cast off the works of darkness and put on the armor of light; let us conduct ourselves becomingly as in the day, not in reveling and drunkenness, not in debauchery and licentiousness, not in quarreling and jealousy. But put on the Lord Jesus Christ, and make no provision for the flesh, to gratify its desires. As for the man who is weak in faith, welcome him, but not for disputes over opinions. One believes he may eat anything, while the weak man eats only vegetables. Let not him who eats despise him who abstains, and let not him who abstains pass judgment on him who eats; for God has welcomed him. Who are you to pass judgment on the servant of another? It is before his own master that he stands or falls. And he will be upheld, for the Master is able to make him stand.

GOSPEL READING for the Sunday of Forgiveness Matthew 6:14-21

The Lord said to His Disciples: If you forgive men their trespasses, your heavenly Father also will forgive you; but if you do not forgive men their trespasses, neither will your Father forgive your trespasses. And when you fast, do not look dismal, like the hypocrites, for they disfigure their faces that their fasting may be seen by men. Truly, I say to you, they have received their reward.

But when you fast, anoint your head and wash your face, that your fasting may not be seen by men but by your Father Who is in secret; and your Father Who sees in secret will reward you. Do not lay up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust consume and where thieves break in and steal, but lay up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust consumes and where thieves do not break in and steal. For where your treasure is, there will your heart be also.


Holy Communion & The Thanksgiving Prayers

In the Orthodox Church, the Sacrament of Communion is offered only to Orthodox Christians who have humbly prepared to receive through prayer and a recent Sacramental Confession.

Non-Orthodox people and those not communing today may approach during Communion for a priestly blessing by saying, "Father, bless." After this you may take a piece of antidoron (blessed bread) offered in the bowls.

If you are interested in joining the One Holy Catholic and Apostolic Church, speak with our Pastor about how to become an Orthodox Christian.

At the conclusion of the Divine Liturgy, we offer **Thanksgiving Prayers** for having received the body and blood of Christ. These beautiful prayers help us to reflect on the mystery in which we have partaken and prepare us for our transition from the Kingdom back into "the world." If you have partaken, stay to listen to these prayers after you have venerated the cross. Immediately after, the priest will bless the Agape Meal. **We ask that all your socializing take place outside of the church.**



Catechesis of the Good Shepherd Reconciliation Retreat March 15-16, 2024

For three weeks *Dominic Salcido*, *Elias Hedges*, *Gabriel Wolfington*, *Jesse Palmer*, *Miriam Vander Laan*, *Niko Halsell*, *and Zoe McDonald* have been preparing for the Reconciliation Retreat that took place this past Friday and Saturday. They began by reflecting on the image of Jesus as the True Vine and themselves as the branches of the True Vine.

They spent time considering how the vine is affected when the life giving "sap" that flows through the vine becomes blocked (sin) and how the Vinedresser (God the Father) works hard to care for the vine to make it healthy and vibrant again. They looked at the parables of the Found Coin, the Found Sheep and the Prodigal Son and reflected on how God rejoices when those that have been "lost" are "found" or reconciled with the Father once more.

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They have also celebrated the gifts of their baptism by remembering the candles that were lit to represent the Light of Christ, the white garment they wore on the day of their baptism to represent the purity of their newly illumined soul and the prayers that were prayed on their behalf by their parents and Godparents. This weekend they made new candles, new garments and said some of those same prayers themselves while being surrounded in prayer by their parents and Godparents or a prayer partner. You may notice those candles today in church and see the white garments they made. These help remind them (and us all!) of the gifts that were given to them on the day of their baptism as well as the gift of reconciliation that God has lovingly offered to all.
