THE EPISTLE READING Acts 9:32-42

In those days, as Peter went here and there among them all, he came down also to the saints that lived at Lydda. There he found a man named Aeneas, who had been bedridden for eight years and was paralyzed. And Peter said to him, "Aeneas, Jesus Christ heals you; rise and make your bed." And immediately he rose. And all the residents of Lydda and Sharon saw him, and they turned to the Lord. Now there was at Joppa a disciple named Tabitha, which means Dorcas. She was full of good works and acts of charity. In those days she fell sick and died; and when they had washed her, they laid her in an upper room. Since Lydda was near Joppa, the disciples, hearing that Peter was there, sent two men to him entreating him, "Please come to us without delay." So Peter rose and went with them. And when he had come, they took him to the upper room. All the widows stood beside him weeping, and showing tunics and other garments, which Dorcas made while she was with them. But Peter put them all outside and knelt down and prayed; then turning to the body he said, "Tabitha, rise." And she opened her eyes, and when she saw Peter she sat up. And he gave her his hand and lifted her up. Then calling the saints and widows he presented her alive. And it became known throughout all Joppa, and many believed in the Lord.

GOSPEL READNG—John 5:1-15

At that time, Jesus went up to Jerusalem. Now there is in Jerusalem by the Sheep Gate a pool, in Hebrew called Bethzatha, which has five porticoes. In these lay a multitude of invalids, blind, lame, paralyzed, waiting for the moving of the water. For an angel of the Lord went down at certain seasons into the pool and troubled the water; whoever stepped in first, after the troubling of the water was healed of whatever disease he had. One man was there, who had been ill for thirty-eight years. When Jesus saw him and knew that he had been lying there a long time, He said to him, "Do you want to be healed?"

The sick man answered Him, "Sir, I have no man to put me into the pool when the water is troubled, and while I am going another steps down before me." Jesus said to him, "Rise, take up your pallet, and walk." And at once the man was healed, and he took up his pallet and walked.

In the Orthodox Church, the Sacrament of Communion is offered only to Orthodox Christians who have humbly prepared to receive through prayer, fasting, and a recent Sacramental Confession.

Non-Orthodox people and those not communing today may approach during Communion for a priestly blessing by saying, "Father, bless." After this you may take a piece of antidoron (blessed bread) offered in the bowls.

St. Athanasius Family,

My grand Cross Country tour of America by bike came to an early end in week two. My "unforeseen events" were the hill country of Ohio.

The intensity of the climbs revealed my cancer treatment recovery was still raw. The first day's climb in Hill Country was 2,500 ft. Day two was 3,800. Day three was 4,000 and that's when something in my left leg let go.

By that time we had climbed a total of about 19,000 ft. overall, but we had 120,000 more ft. to go between Ohio and Oregon. Nevertheless, my body was saying this is the end of our road.

I conferred by phone with my doctor in SB and was advised that I needed a full work up, including oncology, to puzzle this out. I left my bike and bag of camping gear with the group and flew home to SB to my trusted medical team. Tests, x-rays, and scans eliminated the worst possibilities, but didn't provide clarity on the root cause. So, we are left with the obvious: too much, too soon, and too old. I can live with that.

Thanks for your prayers! Let us say together, "Glory to God in all things."
