HOLY COMMUNION

In the Orthodox Church, the sacrament of Communion is offered only to Christians who are baptized in the name of the Trinity and chrismated into the Orthodox Faith. Non-Orthodox believers **may approach the chalice for a blessing and the blessed bread instead of the Eucharist.** So that the priest is aware of this, please just say, "Father, bless" when you get to the chalice.

THE GREAT LITANY

FIRST ANTIPHON—Psalm verses for the Feast of Transfiguration with Refrain

Vs. Great is the Lord, and greatly to be praised, in the city of our God, in His holy mountain. (Ps. 47:2)

Refrain: Through the intercessions of the Theotokos, O Savior, save us.

- Vs. Who settest fast the mountains by Thy strength, Who art girded about with power. (Ps. 64:7-8) [Refrain]
- Vs. Honor and majesty hast Thou put on, who coverest Thyself with light as with a garment. (Ps. 103:1-2) [Refrain]
- Vs. The mountains shall rejoice at the presence of the Lord, for He cometh; yea, He is come to judge the earth. (Ps. 97:8-09) [Refrain]
- Vs. Glory...now & ever...Amen. [Refrain]

SECOND ANTIPHON—Psalm verses for the Feast of Transfiguration with Refrain

Vs. His foundations are in the holy mountains. (Ps. 86:1)

Refrain: O Son of God, transfigured on Mt. Tabor, save us who sing to Thee: Alleluia!

- Vs. The Lord loveth the gates of Zion more than all the dwellings of Jacob. Glorious things are spoken of thee, O city of God. [Refrain]
- Vs. Zion is our mother, a man shall say, and such a man was born in her; and the Most High Himself hath established her. [Refrain]

Only Begotten Son and immortal Word of God who for our salvation didst will to be incarnate of the holy Theotokos and ever-virgin Mary, who without change didst become man and wast crucified, O Christ our God, trampling down death by death, who art one of the Holy Trinity, glorified with the Father and the Holy Spirit: save us!

- Vs. Thine are the heavens, and Thine is the earth; the world and the fullness thereof hast Thou founded. [**Refrain**]

THE EPISTLE READING 2 Peter 1:10-19

Brethren, be the more zealous to confirm your call and election, for if you do this you will never fall; so there will be richly provided for you an entrance into the eternal kingdom of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

Therefore I intend always to remind you of these things, though you know them and are established in the truth that you have. I think it right, as long as I am in this body, to arouse you by way of reminder, since I know that the putting off of my body will be soon, as

our Lord Jesus Christ showed me. And I will see to it that after my departure you may be able at any time to recall these things.

For we did not follow cleverly devised myths when we made known to you the power and coming of our Lord Jesus Christ, but we were eyewitnesses of his majesty. For when he received honor and glory from God the Father and the voice was borne to him by the Majestic Glory, "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased," we heard this voice borne from heaven, for we were with him on the holy mountain. And we have the prophetic word made more sure. You will do well to pay attention to this as to a lamp shining in a dark place, until the day dawns and the morning star rises in your hearts.

GOSPEL READING

Matthew 17:1-9

At that time, Jesus took with him Peter and James and John his brother, and led them up a high mountain apart. And he was transfigured before them, and his face shone like the sun, and his garments became white as light. And behold, there appeared to them Moses and Elijah, talking with him. And Peter said to Jesus, "Lord, it is well that we are here; if you wish, I will make three booths here, one for you and one for Moses and one for Elijah." He was still speaking, when lo, a bright cloud overshadowed them, and a voice from the cloud said, "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased; listen to him!" When the disciples heard this, they fell on their faces, and were filled with awe. But Jesus came and touched them, saying, "Rise, and have no fear." And when they lifted up their eyes, they saw no one but Jesus only.

And as they were coming down the mountain, Jesus commanded them, "Tell no one the vision, until the Son of man is raised from the dead."

LITURGY OF THE FAITHFUL

Hymn to the Mother of God (Meglynarion) for the Feast of Transfiguration

Magnify, O my soul, the Lord who was transfigured on Mount Tabor! Your birthgiving was incorruptible! God came from your body, and appeared on earth in the flesh, dwelling among mankind. Therefore we magnify you, O Theotokos!

Hymn sung as the clergy receive the Eucharist:

O Lord, we shall walk in the light of Your face, and rejoice in Your name all the day. (Ps 88/89:15b)

Instead of "We have seen the true light..." we sing the Troparion of the feast. (Music included on last page of this bulletin.)

At the end of the Divine Liturgy, we offer the prayers of thanksgiving for having received the Body and Blood of Christ. These beautiful prayers help us to reflect on the mystery in which we have just partaken, and prepare us for our transition back into the "world." We invite you to listen to these beautiful prayers during and after the veneration of the cross at the end of the service, and ask that you show courtesy to those who are remaining to hear the prayers in their entirety by waiting until Coffee Hour to socialize.

SURVEY RESULTS—PARISH COMMUNICATIONS

Thank you to all who took the time to take the Parish Communications Survey. 52 people completed the survey—35 online and 17 on paper. The top 3 preferred means of receiving information were 1) the e-mailed bulletin and announcements, 2) the paper bulletin, and 3) e-mailed special announcements. If the 52 respondents are representative of the entire parish, we are still not utilizing the parish website as a hub of information, with 18 people saying that they look at the website 1-5 times per month and 21 people responding that they only look at it 1-4 times per year. 36 out of 52 people said that if the calendar and announce-

ments were only available on the website, they wo old access them once a week. You can access the survey results and comments by going to the page on the parish website where the Sunday bulletins are posted. The survey has confirmed that, for now, we need to continue with both the electronic AND paper communications.


