

And as for that in the good soil, they are those who, hearing the word, hold it fast in an honest and good heart, and bring forth fruit with patience.” As Jesus said this, He called out, “He who has ears to hear, let him hear.”

Butler Premier Shines Light on Saint Nicholas

Steve Butler says composing music is part of his DNA. A professor of music at Westmont for 20 years, he has created more than two dozen commissioned pieces. "It would be very difficult for me to stop writing music," he says. "I do it because that's what I sense God's purpose is for me. I try to give away what he has so freely given to me."

This spring Butler premieres a new composition inspired by Saint Nicholas, a regular guy, who by grace became capable of achieving and then exceeding the limitations of natural ability. "He was a real hero and a true superman," Butler says. "He gives us hope that we too might become closer to holiness and encourages us all to draw nearer to God. Saint Nicholas' generosity and kindness has inspired me and myriad Christians over the centuries."

The hour-long piece, which includes text from ancient hymns and prayers honoring and praising Saint Nicholas, requires a large orchestra, organ, full choir, children's choir and four soloists. "The Christian hymns are beautiful expressions of prayer and a means of entry into the timeless and eternal peace of Jesus Christ in the Heavenly Kingdom," Butler says. "I hope the work will help change our

everyday lives through the words and sounds of purification and illumination."

The musical language for the Saint Nicholas Oratorio echoes what Butler wrote in the Resurrection Oratorio he premiered six years ago: neo-tonal music in an accessible choral style.

"In my work, I'm always trying to take us all beyond the superficial, beyond the surface reflection, to realize there is a deeper and fulfilling contemplative experience of beauty for the illumined Christian," Butler says. "We can transcend even beyond the words, the notes, the musical material and physical reality of the piece through the gift of grace and the reality of faith."

"I'm blessed to be able to develop my professional craft by searching my soul, to reveal in some tangible musical way, the exhilaration, the profundity, and the pure gratitude that I have for God's revelation of Himself and His saints through the person of Jesus Christ."

Butler quotes an Athonite monk, "Whether you are a beautifully crafted mirror or only the lid of a tin can, you still won't dazzle if the sun's rays don't fall on you."

"I'm trying my best to stand out in the sun," Butler says.


