#### **HOLY COMMUNION**

In the Orthodox Church, the sacrament of Communion is offered only to Orthodox Christians who have prepared to receive. Non-Orthodox believers and others **may approach the chalice for a blessing and the blessed bread instead of the Eucharist.** So that the priest is aware of this, please just say, "Father, bless" when you get to the chalice.

Vs. It is good to give praise unto the Lord, and to chant unto Thy name, O Most High; To proclaim Thy mercy in the morning, and Thy truth by night. [Refrain]

#### Refrain: Through the intercessions of the Theotokos, O Savior, save us.

- Vs. Upright is the Lord our God, and there is no unrighteousness in Him. [Refrain]
- Vs. Glory...now & ever...Amen. [Refrain]

#### SECOND ANTIPHON—Psalm verses with refrain

Vs. The Lord is King, He is clothed with majesty; the Lord is clothed with strength and hath girded Himself.

I fast twice a week; I give tithes of all that I get.' But the tax collector, standing far off, would not even lift up his eyes to Heaven, but beat his breast, saying, 'God, be merciful to me a sinner!' I tell you, this man went down to his house justified rather than the other; for everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, but he who humbles himself will be exalted."



# PARISH COUNCIL CORNER

#### **Warming Kitchen Update**

The county has issued our permits. Due to annual cost increases and increases due to supply demand, the cost for the kitchen will be more than originally planned. Thankfully, we have golf tournament money earmarked for the kitchen and other savings that will cover the extra cost. BDS Construction (Brian Sieck) will be the General Contractor. Thank you to Dn. Scott for his work on this project and for serving as the Owner's (SAOC) Representative during construction. We HOPE to have the kitchen completed by Pascha barring any unforeseen delays.

#### **Unauthorized Parking in our Church Lot**

The church parking lot serves as a night-time parking place for a family through the Safe Parking program. Recently there have been several unauthorized vehicles parked overnight - and some 24 hours/day. SAOC will be using a local towing company to tow unauthorized vehicles. The company will place signs on the premises to help prevent unauthorized parking and tow when necessary. We will monitor the lot for the first two weeks of the towing program and ask the sheriff to patrol our property more frequently during this time.

## **Security Plan**

A committee consisting of Fr. Symeon, Valerie Yova, Robert Rachhaus and Dominic Dopico has been assessing the security needs of SAOC. The PC approved the purchase of an alarm system, which will be installed in the next several months. The committee will continue to evaluate security needs and monitor the new system.

#### THE SUNDAY OF THE PUBLICAN & PHARISEE

One of the lessons of the Gospel Parable of the Publican and the Pharisee (Luke 18:10-14) is that humility is a virtue needed as a precondition for further spiritual growth. It isn't a goal that we strive for and hope to achieve in some distant future after years of Christian maturation, but it is part of the foundation we need for further growth.

Jesus Himself tells the Parable of the Publican and Pharisee to extol the virtue of humility. We've all been told endless times that the Pharisee in the story is the religious zealot. He does everything he boasts of doing. He is not lying nor exaggerating but telling the truth about his piety. He is laying claim to the reward he assumes God must bestow upon him for his virtue. The Publican is the notorious sinner of the parable, who admits before God that he is a sinner and begs God's mercy. As even St. John Chrysostom notes, it is not particularly humble to admit you are a sinner when in fact you are one – you are just acknowledging the truth of the matter. The Publican has little to commend himself to God, and yet it is he, not the pious and self-righteous Pharisee, that is favored by God because God rejects the pride of the Pharisee and embraces the humility of the Publican. The Publican goes beyond admitting to the truth and accepting the judgment that is laid on him. Therein lies his humility. He cannot lay claim to any reward for virtue, but opens himself to the mercy and love of God.

Jesus said: "I tell you, this person went down to his/her house justified rather than the first; for every one who exalts himself will be humbled, but he who humbles himself will be exalted." (Luke 18:14)
