

HOLY COMMUNION

In the Orthodox Church, the sacrament of Communion is offered only to Orthodox Christians who have prepared to receive. Non-Orthodox believers and others **may approach the chalice for a blessing and the blessed bread instead of the Eucharist.** So that the priest is aware of this, please just say, "Father, bless" when you get to the chalice.

At the conclusion of Matins, we sing the Great Doxology followed by the Matins Dismissal Troparion

GREAT LITANY

FIRST ANTIPHON verses for the Feast of the Cross with refrain:

Vs. O God, my God, attend to me; why hast Thou forsaken me? Far from my salvation are the words of my transgressions.

Refrain: Through the intercessions of the Theotokos, O Savior, save us.

- Vs. My God, I will cry by day, and wilt Thou not hearken? But as for Thee, Thou dwellest in the sanctuary, O Praise of Israel. [Refrain]
- Vs. Glory...now & ever...Amen. [Refrain]

SECOND ANTIPHON verses for the Feast of the Cross & refrain

Vs. O God, why hast Thou cast us off unto the end? Remember Thy congregation which Thou hast purchased from the beginning.

Refrain: O Son Of God, crucified in the flesh, save us who sing to Thee, Alleluia!

- Vs. This is Mount Zion wherein Thou hast dwelt. [Refrain]
- Vs. God is our King before the ages, He hath wrought salvation in the midst of the earth. [Refrain]

Glory to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit; Now and ever and unto ages of ages. Amen.

Only Begotten Son and immortal Word of God who for our salvation didst will to be incarnate of the holy Theotokos and ever virgin Mary, who without change didst become man and wast crucified, O Christ our God, trampling down death by death, who art one of the Holy Trinity, glorified with the Father and the Holy Spirit: save us!

THIRD ANTIPHON and verses for the Feast of the Cross

Vs. The Lord is king, let the peoples rage; He sitteth on the Cherubim, let the earth be shaken.

Refrain: Troparion for the Feast of the Cross

O Lord save Thy people and bless Thine inheritance, granting victory over all adversaries. And by the pow'r of Thy cross protect us.

- Vs. The Lord is great in Zion, and He is high above all peoples.
- Vs. Let them confess Thy great Name, for it is terrible and holy.

AS THE CLERGY ENTER THE ALTAR AT THE LITTLE ENTRANCE, WE SING THE FOLLOWING HYMNS FOR THE DAY:

Troparion of the Resurrection

Tone 5

Let us believers praise and worship the Word, co-eternal with the Father and the Spirit, born of the Virgin for our salvation.

For He took pleasure in ascending the Cross in the flesh to suffer death and to raise the dead by His glorious resurrection.

Troparion for the Feast of the Elevation of the Holy Cross

Tone 1

O Lord save Thy people and bless Thine inheritance, granting victory over all adversaries. And by the pow'r of Thy cross protect us.

Troparion to St. Athanasius

Tone 3

Holy Bishop Athanasius, you became a stronghold of Orthodoxy, strengthening the Church through your divine teachings. Opposing the heretical opinion of Arius, you explained and taught that the Son is equal in nature with the Father. O holy Father, intercede with Christ God that He may grant us abundant mercy.

Kontakion for the Feast of the Cross

Tone 4

As You were voluntarily raised upon the <u>Cross</u> for our sake, grant mercy to those who are called by Your Name, O <u>Christ</u> God; make all Orthodox Christians glad by your <u>power</u>, granting them victories over their <u>ad</u>versaries// by bestowing on them the invincible trophy, Your weapon of peace!

Holy God, Holy Mighty, Holy Immortal, have mercy on us.

+Glory to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit, now and ever and unto ages of ages. Amen.

Deacon: With strength!

People: Holy God, Holy Mighty, Holy Immortal, have mercy on us.

Preparatory Psalm verses before the Epistle (Prokeimenon) (Music on page 59 of Liturgy book)

Tone 4

O Lord, how manifold are Thy works, in wisdom Thou hast made them all. (Ps 103/104:24)

Vs. Bless the Lord O my soul, O Lord my God, Thou art very great.

EPISTLE READING Galatians. (2:16-20)

Brethren, you know that a man is not justified by works of the law but through faith in Jesus Christ. Even we have believed in Christ Jesus, in order to be justified by faith in Christ, and not by works of the law, because by works of the law shall no one be justified. But if, in our endeavor to be justified in Christ, we ourselves were found to be sinners, is Christ then an agent of sin? Certainly not! But if I build up again those things which I tore down, then I prove myself a transgressor. For I through the Law died to the Law, that I might live to God. I have been crucified with Christ; it is no longer I who live, but Christ Who lives in me; and the life I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the Son of God, Who loved me and gave Himself for me.

GOSPEL READING Mark. (8:34-9:1)

The Lord said, "If any man would come after Me, let him deny himself and take up his cross and follow Me. For whoever would save his life will lose it; and whoever loses his life for My sake and the Gospel's will save it. For what does it profit a man, to gain the whole world and forfeit his soul? For what can a man give in return for his soul? For whoever is ashamed of Me and of My words in this adulterous and sinful generation, of him will the Son of man also be ashamed, when He comes in the glory of His Father with the holy angels." And He said to them, "Truly, I say to you, there are some standing here who will not taste death before they see the Kingdom of God come with power."

Meglynarion (Hymn to the Mother of God) for the Feast of the Cross)

Thou art the mystical paradise, O Theotokos, in which blossomed Christ. Through Him, the life-bearing wood of the Cross was planted upon earth. Now, at its elevation, as we bow down before it, we magnify Thee.

Communion Hymn

Praise the Lord from the heavens; praise Him in the Highest!

The light of Your countenance has shone on us, O Lord. (Ps 4/5:6) Alleluia (3x)

We invite you to listen to these beautiful prayers during and after the veneration of the cross at the end of the service, and <u>ask that you show courtesy to those who are remaining to hear the prayers in their entirety by waiting until the blessing of the food at Coffee Hour to eat and socialize.</u>



A closer look at...

The Divine Liturgy

(From "The Heavenly Banquet: Understanding the Divine Liturgy" by Fr. Emmanuel Hatzidakis)

The Eucharistic meal is the *heavenly Banquet* here on earth, which prepares us for the eternal *heavenly Banquet*—not that there are two banquets, bur only one: "One only is the power of the Table, one the Host in both worlds. The one is the wedding feast with the Bridegroom Himself, the other is the preparation for that wedding feast." (Nicholas Cabasilas, *The Life in Christ*) The one introduces the faithful to the other. Those who have partaken of the one have already received a taste of the heavenly meal. "Already they have enjoyed the other delight of the Banquet though they do not obtain it fully yet; but when Christ has been manifested they will perceive more clearly what it is that they have brought with them." (Cabasilas)

SUNDAY MORNING AGAPE MEAL

This fall we will be making a slight shift in how we think about and organize our fellowship time after the Divine Liturgy. Active parish members received an e-mail last week from Fr. Symeon explaining this shift.

In the early church, after worshipping together, the Christians would share a meal together, referred to as the "Agape Meal." The "breaking of bread" which takes place after the Divine Liturgy is an important extension of the union we experience in the Eucharist.



Modeling the spirit of this meal, we will be shifting away from coffee and snacks to a simple meal on most Sunday, during which we can share fellowship, provide hospitality to visitors, and nurture a spirit of generosity and service in the parish.

To encourage participation from all parish households, we are forming Agape Meal Teams that will work together to share the labor of loving hospitality. Suzi Wiley is coordinating this effort. If you are willing to serve as a Team Leader or team member, please contact her at: suziwiley@cox.net.
